## HOUSE BILL NO. 1018

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-9-14, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS WHERE THE SUPERINTENDENT IS 3 ELECTED AND THE SUPERINTENDENT IS NOT REELECTED TO CONTINUE 4 SERVING AS SUPERINTENDENT OF THAT SCHOOL DISTRICT, THEN THAT SUPERINTENDENT SHALL NOT BRING DISMISSAL ACTIONS AGAINST 6 CONTRACTED EMPLOYEES AFTER THE ELECTION RESULTS, EXCEPT IN EXTREME 7 CIRCUMSTANCES THAT THREATEN THE SAFETY OF STUDENTS, FACULTY OR 8 STAFF; TO PROVIDE THAT A CONTRACTED EMPLOYEE SHALL CONTINUE TO BE PAID UNTIL THE END OF THE CONTRACT YEAR UNLESS THE CONTRACTED 9 EMPLOYEE IS FOUND TO BE A THREAT; TO PROVIDE THAT ANY EMPLOYEE OF 10 11 ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL NOT BE PROHIBITED FROM PARTICIPATING IN 12 THE ELECTION PROCESS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 37-9-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 37-9-14. (1) It <u>is</u> the duty of the superintendent of schools to administer the schools within his district and to

implement the decisions of the school board.

- 19 (2) In addition to all other powers, authority and duties 20 imposed or granted by law, the superintendent of schools <u>has</u> the 21 following powers, authority and duties:
- 22 (a) To enter into contracts in the manner provided by
  23 law with each assistant superintendent, principal and teacher of
  24 the public schools under his supervision, after the assistant
  25 superintendent, principal and teachers have been selected and
  26 approved in the manner provided by law.
- (b) To enforce in the public schools of the school

  28 district the courses of study provided by law or the rules and

  29 regulations of the State Board of Education, and to comply with

  30 the law with reference to the use and distribution of free

  31 textbooks.

amended as follows:

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- 32 (c) To administer oaths in all cases to persons
- 33 testifying before him relative to disputes relating to the schools
- 34 submitted to him for determination, and to take testimony in those
- 35 cases as provided by law.
- 36 (d) To examine the monthly and annual reports submitted
- 37 to him by principals and teachers for the purpose of determining
- 38 and verifying the accuracy thereof.
- 39 (e) To preserve all reports of superintendents,
- 40 principals, teachers and other school officers, and to deliver to
- 41 his successor or clerk of the board of supervisors all money,
- 42 property, books, effects and papers.
- 43 (f) To prepare and keep in his office a map or maps
- 44 showing the territory embraced in his school district, to furnish
- 45 the county assessor with a copy of the map or maps, and to revise
- 46 and correct same from time to time as changes in or alterations of
- 47 school districts may necessitate.
- 48 (g) To keep an accurate record of the names of all of
- 49 the members of the school board showing the districts for which
- 50 each was elected or appointed, the post office address of each,
- 51 and the date of the expiration of his term of office. All
- 52 official correspondence shall be addressed to the school board,
- 53 and notice to  $\underline{\text{the}}$  members shall be regarded as notice to the
- 54 residents of the district, and it is the duty of the members to
- 55 notify the residents.
- 56 (h) To deliver in proper time to the assistant
- 57 superintendents, principals, teachers and board members such
- 58 forms, records and other supplies that may be needed during the
- 59 school year as provided by law or any applicable rules and
- 60 regulations, and to give to  $\underline{\text{those}}$  individuals the information with
- 61 regard to their duties as may be required.
- (i) To make to the school board reports for each
- 63 scholastic month in such form as the school board may require.

- (j) To distribute promptly all reports, letters, forms,
- 65 circulars and instructions that he may receive for the use of
- 66 school officials.
- (k) To keep on file and preserve in his office all
- 68 appropriate information concerning the affairs of the school
- 69 district.
- 70 (1) To visit the schools of his school district in his
- 71 discretion, and to require the assistant superintendents,
- 72 principals and teachers thereof to perform their duties as
- 73 prescribed by law.
- 74 (m) To observe such instructions and regulations as the
- 75 school board and other public officials may prescribe, and to make
- 76 special reports to these officers whenever required.
- 77 (n) To keep his office open for the transaction of
- 78 business upon the days and during the hours to be designated by
- 79 the school board.
- 80 (o) To make such reports as are required by the State
- 81 Board of Education.
- 82 (p) To make an enumeration of educable children in his
- 83 school district as prescribed by law.
- 84 (q) To keep in his office and carefully preserve the
- 85 public school record provided, to enter therein the proceedings of
- 86 the school board and his decision upon cases and his other
- 87 official acts, to record therein the data required from the
- 88 monthly and term reports of principals and teachers, and from the
- 89 summaries of records thus kept.
- 90 (r) To delegate student disciplinary matters to
- 91 appropriate school personnel.
- 92 (s) To make assignments to the various schools in the
- 93 district of all noninstructional and nonlicensed employees and all
- 94 licensed employees, as provided in Sections 37-9-15 and 37-9-17,
- 95 and to make reassignments of those employees from time to time;
- 96 however, a reassignment of a licensed employee may only be to an

- 97 area in which the employee has a valid license issued by the State
- 98 Department of Education. Upon request from any employee
- 99 transferred, the assignment shall be subject to review by the
- 100 school board.
- 101 (t) To employ substitutes for licensed employees,
- 102 regardless of whether or not the substitute holds the proper
- 103 license, subject to such reasonable rules and regulations as may
- 104 be adopted by the State Board of Education.
- 105 (u) To comply in a timely manner with the compulsory
- 106 education reporting requirements prescribed in Section
- 107 37-13-91(6).
- 108 (v) To perform such other duties as may be required of
- 109 him by law.
- 110 (w) To notify, in writing, the parent, guardian or
- 111 custodian, the youth court and local law enforcement of any
- 112 expulsion of a student for criminal activity as defined in Section
- 113 37-11-92.
- 114 (x) To notify the youth court and local law enforcement
- 115 agencies, by affidavit, of the occurrence of any crime committed
- 116 by a student or students upon school property or during any
- 117 school-related activity, regardless of location and the identity
- 118 of the student or students committing the crime.
- 119 (y) To employ and dismiss noninstructional and
- 120 nonlicensed employees as provided by law.
- 121 (3) All funds to the credit of a school district shall be
- 122 paid out on pay certificates issued by the superintendent upon
- 123 order of the school board of the school district properly entered
- 124 upon the minutes thereof, and all such orders shall be supported
- 125 by properly itemized invoices from the vendors covering the
- 126 materials and supplies purchased. All such orders and the
- 127 itemized invoices supporting same shall be filed as a public
- 128 record in the office of the superintendent for a period of five
- 129 (5) years. The superintendent shall be liable upon his official

- 130 bond for the amount of any pay certificate issued in violation of
- 131 the provisions of this section. The school board may direct and
- 132 cause warrants to be issued against the district funds for the
- 133 purpose of refunding any amount of taxes erroneously or illegally
- 134 paid into the fund when the refund has been approved in the manner
- 135 provided by law.
- 136 (4) The superintendent of schools shall be special
- 137 accounting officer and treasurer with respect to any and all
- 138 district school funds for his school district. He or his designee
- 139 shall issue all warrants without the necessity of registration
- 140 thereof by the chancery clerk. Transactions with the depositories
- 141 and with the various tax collecting agencies that involve school
- 142 funds for the school district shall be with the superintendent of
- 143 schools, or his designee.
- 144 (5) The superintendent of schools will have no
- 145 responsibility with regard to agricultural high school and junior
- 146 college funds.
- 147 All agricultural high school and junior college funds shall
- 148 be handled and expended in the manner provided for in Sections
- 149 37-29-31 through 37-29-39.
- 150 (6) It is the duty of the superintendent of schools to keep
- 151 and preserve the minutes of the proceedings of the school board.
- 152 (7) The superintendent of schools shall maintain as a record
- in his office a book or a computer printout in which he shall
- 154 enter all demands, claims and accounts paid from any funds of the
- 155 school district. The record shall be in a form to be prescribed
- 156 by the State Auditor. All demands, claims and accounts filed
- 157 shall be preserved by the superintendent of schools as a public
- 158 record for a period of five (5) years. All claims found by the
- 159 school board to be illegal shall be rejected or disallowed. All
- 160 claims that are found to be legal and proper shall be allowed and
- 161 ratified as paid by the superintendent of schools. All claims as
- 162 to which a continuance is requested by the claimant and those

found to be defective but which may be perfected by amendment 163 shall be continued. The superintendent of schools shall issue a 164 165 pay certificate against any legal and proper fund of the school 166 district in favor of the claimant in payment of claims. 167 provisions of this section, however, shall not be applicable to 168 the payment of teachers' salaries, salaries of drivers of publicly owned school buses, travel advances, amounts due private 169 170 contractors or other obligations where the amount thereof has been previously approved by a contract or by an order of the school 171 board entered upon its minutes, or by inclusion in the current 172 173 fiscal year budget, and all such amounts may be paid by the superintendent of schools by pay certificates issued by him 174 175 against the legal and proper fund without allowance of a specific 176 claim therefor as provided in this section, provided that the 177 payment thereof is otherwise in conformity with law. 178 (8) In school districts where the superintendent is elected, if the superintendent is not reelected to continue serving as 179 180 superintendent of that school district, then that superintendent shall not bring dismissal actions against contracted employees 181 182 after the election results, except in extreme circumstances that threaten the safety of students, faculty or staff. When the 183 184 superintendent is not reelected, a contracted employee shall 185 continue to be paid until the end of the contract year unless the contracted employee is found to be a threat as provided in this 186 187 section. SECTION 2. Any employee of any school district, including 188

superintendents, principals and teachers shall not be prohibited

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from participating in the election process.
