HOUSE BILL NO. 1142

AN ACT TO CREATE THE STUDY COMMITTEE ON A STATEWIDE BUILDING 1 2 CODE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE STUDY COMMITTEE; TO REQUIRE THE STUDY COMMITTEE TO ADDRESS CERTAIN ISSUES AND REPORT THEIR FINDINGS TO THE LEGISLATURE; TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF STATE AGENCY PERSONNEL AS SUPPORT STAFF; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 3 4 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. (1) There is hereby created the Study Committee on a Statewide Building Code, hereinafter referred to as the 8 9 "study committee." The purpose of the study committee is: (a) To explore establishing minimum standards for 10 building construction that would help property owners qualify for 11 relief funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 12 after a natural disaster such as a tornado, hurricane, fire or 13 14 earthquake. (b) To address concerns from national insurers who are 15 16 not renewing property insurance due to a lack of building standards in many areas of Mississippi; and 17 (c) To promote the health, safety and welfare of the 18 19 public. The Study Committee on a Statewide Building Code shall 20 (2) 21 consist of the following members: 22 (a) The Mississippi Commissioner of Insurance or the 23 Deputy State Fire Marshal as his designee; The Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency 24 (b) Management Agency or a member of his staff as his designee; 25 (c) The Executive Director of the Association of 26 27 Building Officials or a representative of the Association as his 28 designee; \*HR40/R1835\* H. 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(d) The Executive Director of the Bureau of Building,
Grounds and Real Property Management of the Department of Finance
and Administration or a representative of the Bureau of Building,
Grounds and Real Property Management as his designee;

33 (e) The Executive Director of the State Board of
34 Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors or a
35 member of the State Board of Registration for Professional
36 Engineers and Land Surveyors as his designee;

37 (f) The Executive Director of the State Board of Public
38 Contractors or a member of the State Board of Public Contractors
39 as his designee;

40 (g) The Executive Director of the State Board of
41 Architecture or a member of the State Board of Architecture as his
42 designee;

43 (h) One (1) member of the Mississippi House of
44 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of
45 Representatives; and

46 (i) One (1) member of the Mississippi State Senate47 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.

(3) The Executive Director of the State Board of Architecture shall call for the first meeting at which time the delegates shall appoint a chairman for the study committee. The business of the first meeting shall include the establishment of a meeting schedule that assures successful completion of the study within the stated schedule, and within the allocated budget.

54 (4) Nonlegislative members shall serve without salary or per
55 diem compensation; however, all members shall be entitled to
56 actual travel expenses as provided for in Section 25-3-41.
57 Legislative members shall be entitled to per diem, expense
58 allowance and mileage as authorized for committee meetings when
59 the Legislature is not in session.

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Legislature and the Governor to be delivered no later than
December 1, 2004. This report shall address at a minimum:

(a) A survey of other states to determine the types of
statewide building codes and enforcement systems which are in
place and which are successful;

(b) An investigation of existing model codes such as
the Standard Building Code, International Building Code, NFPA and
Life Safety Code to determine which is appropriate for
Mississippi, and what modifications would be necessary;

(c) A survey of the laws of other states and jurisdictions, including professional standards of care for architects, engineers, fabricators, contractors and builders, regarding minimal construction standards;

(d) A determination of the capacity of existing agencies, including municipal and county building officials, that now handle administrative and enforcement issues, to administer a state wide building code, or the necessity of creating new agencies to administer such a code;

(e) A recommendation regarding permit fee structures or other means that would offset costs of implementing the recommendations of the study committee.

82 (f) A recommendation regarding exemptions for 83 jurisdictions wherein an effective code is already enacted and 84 enforced;

85 (g) Recommendations for exempting certain building 86 types that do not affect public welfare and safety (e.g. single 87 and double family residences, farm buildings and nonassembly and 88 institutional buildings less than five thousand (5,000) square 89 feet); and

90 (h) Any recommended legislation to implement the91 recommendations of the study committee.

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93 support from any state agency enumerated in this act to assist the
94 task force in caring out its responsibilities.

95 (7) Upon presentation of its final report, the study96 committee shall be dissolved.

97 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 98 and after its passage and shall stand repealed on July 1, 2005.
