HOUSE BILL NO. 1177

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-151-85, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION MAY COMPENSATE SCHOOL 2 3 BUS DRIVERS WHO PROVIDE DRIVING SERVICES TO CERTAIN STATE OPERATED 4 SCHOOLS FOR ACTUAL EXPENSES INCURRED WHEN ACQUIRING AN INITIAL OR THE RENEWAL OF A COMMERCIAL LICENSE IN ORDER TO DRIVE A SCHOOL 5 6 BUS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. Section 37-151-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 9 10 37-151-85. (1) The amount to be allotted by the State Board of Education for transportation shall be determined as follows: 11 The State Department of Education shall calculate the cost of 12 transportation in school districts by ascertaining the average 13 14 cost per pupil in average daily attendance of transported pupils in school districts classified in different density groups as 15 determined by the State Department of Education. Based on these 16 17 calculations, the State Department of Education shall develop a scale for determining the allowable cost per pupil in different 18 density groups, which scale shall provide greatest allowance per 19 20 pupil transported in school districts with lowest densities and smallest allowance per pupil in school districts with highest 21 densities. The total allowance in the adequate education program 22 for transported children for any school district for the current 23 24 year shall be the average daily attendance of the transported children for the nine (9) months of the prior year, multiplied by 25 the allowance per transported pupil as provided herein. However, 26 27 the State Department of Education is hereby authorized and 2.8 empowered to make proper adjustments in allotments, under rules

and regulations of the State Board of Education, in cases where

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- major changes in the number of children in average daily 30 31 attendance transported occur from one year to another as a result 32 of changes or alterations in the boundaries of school districts, a change in or relocation of attendance centers, or for other 33 34 reasons which would result in major decrease or increase in the 35 number of children in average daily attendance transported during 36 the current school year as compared with the preceding year. Moreover, the State Board of Education is hereby authorized and 37 empowered to make such payments to all districts and/or 38 39 university-based programs as deemed necessary in connection with 40 transporting exceptional children as defined in Section 37-23-3. The State Board of Education shall establish and implement all 41 necessary rules and regulations to allot transportation payments 42 43 to university-based programs. In developing density classifications under the provisions hereof, the State Department 44 of Education may give consideration to the length of the route, 45 46 the sparsity of the population, the lack of adequate roads, 47 highways and bridges, and the presence of large streams or other geographic obstacles. In addition to funds allotted under the 48 49 above provisions, funds shall be allotted to each school district 50 that transports students from their assigned school or attendance 51 center to classes in an approved vocational-technical center at a rate per mile not to exceed the average statewide cost per mile of 52 53 school bus transportation during the preceding year exclusive of 54 bus replacement. All such transportation must have prior approval 55 by the State Department of Education. 56 (2) The average daily attendance of transported children 57 shall be reported by the school district in which such children
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 57 shall be reported by the school district in which such children
 58 attend school. If children living in a school district are
 59 transported at the expense of such school district to another
 60 school district, the average daily attendance of such transported
 61 children shall be deducted by the State Department of Education
 62 from the aggregate average daily attendance of transported
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- 63 children in the school district in which they attend school and
- 64 shall be added to the aggregate average daily attendance of
- 65 transported children of the school district from which they come
- 66 for the purpose of calculating transportation allotments.
- 67 However, such deduction shall not be made for the purpose of
- 68 calculating adequate education program pupil-based funding.
- 69 (3) The State Department of Education shall include in the
- 70 allowance for transportation for each school district an amount
- 71 for the replacement of school buses or the purchase of new buses,
- 72 which amount shall be calculated upon the estimated useful life of
- 73 all school buses being used for the transportation of children in
- 74 such school district, whether such buses be publicly or privately
- 75 owned.
- 76 (4) The school boards of all districts operating school bus
- 77 transportation are authorized and directed to establish a salary
- 78 schedule for school bus drivers. No school district shall be
- 79 entitled to receive the funds herein allotted for transportation
- 80 unless it pays each of its nonstudent adult school bus drivers
- 81 paid from such transportation allotments a minimum of One Hundred
- 82 Ninety Dollars (\$190.00) per month. In addition, local school
- 83 boards may compensate school bus drivers for actual expenses
- 84 incurred when acquiring an initial commercial license or any
- 85 renewal of a commercial license in order to drive a school bus.
- 86 (5) The State Board of Education shall be authorized and
- 87 empowered to use such part of the funds appropriated for
- 88 transportation in the adequate education fund as may be necessary
- 89 to finance driver training courses as provided for in Section
- 90 37-41-1, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 91 (6) The State Board of Education, acting through the
- 92 Department of Education, may compensate school bus drivers, who
- 93 are providing driving services to the various state operated
- 94 schools, such as the Mississippi School for the Deaf, the
- 95 Mississippi School for the Blind, the Mississippi School of the

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- 97 similar state operated schools, for actual expenses incurred when
- 98 acquiring an initial commercial license or any renewal of a
- 99 <u>commercial license in order to drive a school bus.</u>
- 100 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 101 and after July 1, 2004.
