HOUSE BILL NO. 1275

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-321, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE SCHOOL SECURITY PERSONNEL TO RECEIVE A CERTAIN NUMBER OF HOURS OF CONTINUING EDUCATION EACH YEAR; TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-93, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE A SCHOOL CRISIS MANAGEMENT PROGRAM RESPONSE TEAM TO OPERATE EMERGENCY RESPONSE VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE IN CERTAIN AREAS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 37-7-321, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

37-7-321. (1) The school board of any school district 11 within the State of Mississippi, in its discretion, may employ one 12 or more persons as security personnel and may designate such 13 14 persons as peace officers in or on any property operated for 15 school purposes by such board upon their taking such oath and making such bond as required of a constable of the county in which 16 17 the school district is situated. The security personnel or officer shall receive a minimum of forty (40) hours of continuing 18 education each year that is sponsored or approved by the State 19 20 Department of Education.

(2) Any person employed by a school board as a security 21 guard or school resource officer or in any other position that has 22 23 the powers of a peace officer must receive a minimum level of 24 basic law enforcement training, as jointly determined and prescribed by the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and 25 Training and the State Board of Education, within two (2) years of 26 the person's initial employment in such position. Upon the 27 28 failure of any person employed in such position to receive the 29 required training within the designated time, the person may not

30 exercise the powers of a peace officer in or on the property of 31 the school district.

32 (3) The school board is authorized and empowered, in its
33 discretion, and subject to the approval of the Federal
34 Communications Commission, to install and operate a noncommercial
35 radio broadcasting and transmission station for educational and
36 vocational educational purposes.

37 SECTION 2. Section 37-3-93, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 38 amended as follows:

37-3-93. (1) Subject to the availability of funding 39 40 specifically appropriated for such purpose, there is established a School Crisis Management Program under the State Department of 41 42 Education. This program is to be initiated and executed by the department using only existing staff and resources. Under this 43 program, the State Department of Education shall create an office 44 making available a quick response team of personnel trained in 45 46 school safety and crisis management to respond to traumatic or 47 violent situations that impact students and faculty in the public schools in Mississippi. The School Crisis Management Program 48 49 shall operate in accordance with the following:

50 (a) The basic response team shall consist of those
51 personnel designated by the State Superintendent of Public
52 Education, or their designees, depending on the size of the school
53 and the nature of the event.

(b) In order to access the services of a response team,
the request must be made by the local school principal or the
superintendent of schools, who shall make the request to the State
Department of Education or its contact designee.

(c) A response team shall enter a school to work with
students and faculty for a period of no more than three (3) days,
unless otherwise requested by the school district.

No. 1275 * * HR07/R1715 04/HR07/R1715 PAGE 2 (CTE\HS) 63 the purpose of receiving reports of suspected cases of school 64 violence and other traumatic situations impacting on students and 65 faculty in the public schools.

(e) The request made by a school district to access the services of a response team following a school safety incident may seek a review of the local school district's safety plan, and the results of this evaluation may be published by the local school board in a newspaper with wide circulation in the district.

(f) Subject to the availability of funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, the expenses of the quick response teams and their administrative support shall be provided from state funds. The State Department of Education may apply for and expend funds for the support and maintenance of this program from private and other funding sources.

77 (g) The response team may operate emergency response
78 vehicles and equipment to provide technical assistance in the
79 areas of emergency operations, physical security, law enforcement,
80 behavioral science services and education administration.

81 (2) Local school districts, school superintendents and 82 principals may request and utilize the services of quick response 83 teams provided for under this section; however, this section does 84 not require school officials to request the services of quick 85 response teams.

86 (3) This section shall be repealed on July 1, 2007.
87 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
88 and after July 1, 2004.
