HOUSE BILL NO. 1313

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-515, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT MUNICIPAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS SHALL NOT BE 2 3 AUTHORIZED TO ENFORCE SPEEDING VIOLATIONS ON INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS; TO PROVIDE AN EXCEPTION FOR MUNICIPALITIES WITH A POPULATION IN 4 EXCESS OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-515, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8

63-3-515. (1) The boards of supervisors of counties and the 9 governing authorities of municipalities are hereby authorized to 10 adopt by order or resolution and to enforce within their 11 respective territorial boundaries the maximum legal rate of speed 12 13 at which a motor vehicle may be run or operated along any public 14 street, road, highway (except state-maintained highways), or portion thereof in the vicinity of schools and churches, upon 15 16 levees and causeways and in other special zones which the board or governing authorities may designate. The rate of speed so 17 established shall be determined upon the basis of an engineering 18 19 and traffic study. The order or resolution setting such speed limits may provide that such limits are only effective during 20 21 specified times of the day, days of the week and months of the 22 year.

<u>(2)</u> Municipal law enforcement officers shall not be
authorized to enforce speeding violations on interstate highways.
This subsection shall not be applicable to law enforcement
officers in municipalities having a population in excess of one
hundred fifty thousand (150,000), according to the latest federal
decennial census.

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29 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 30 and after July 1, 2004.
