## HOUSE BILL NO. 1377

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-313, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE PROOF OF UNITED STATES COAST GUARD CERTIFICATION FOR 2.
- 3 CHARTER VESSELS TRANSPORTING MORE THAN SIX PASSENGERS; AND FOR
- 4 RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 49-15-313, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 49-15-313. (1) Any resident between the ages of sixteen
- 9 (16) and sixty-five (65) years, as defined in Section 49-7-3,
- fishing in the marine waters of the state, shall obtain a 10
- saltwater sports fishing license for a fee of Four Dollars 11
- (\$4.00). This license shall be valid in any waters south of 12
- 13 Interstate 10. Any resident citizen who is blind, paraplegic or a
- multiple amputee, or who has been adjudged by the Veterans 14
- Administration as having a total service-connected disability, or 15
- 16 has been adjudged totally disabled by the Social Security
- Administration shall not be required to purchase or have in his 17
- possession a saltwater sports fishing license while engaged in 18
- 19 such activities. Any resident exempt under this section shall
- have on his person while fishing proof of residency and age or 20
- 21 disability.
- (2) The commission shall prescribe the forms, types and fees 22
- 23 for nonresident saltwater sports fishing licenses except that the
- fee for a nonresident saltwater sports fishing license shall not 24
- be less than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00). The commission shall 25
- 26 require a nonresident to purchase a nonresident freshwater fishing
- 2.7 license and a nonresident saltwater sports fishing license if the

- 28 nonresident's state requires both licenses for a nonresident to
- 29 fish in its marine waters.
- 30 (3) All resident vessels engaged in charter boat fishing,
- 31 party boat fishing, head boat and guide boat fishing shall be
- 32 issued a separate annual license by the commission at a fee of Two
- 33 Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). All nonresident vessels engaged in
- 34 charter boat fishing, party boat fishing, head boat and guide boat
- 35 fishing shall be issued a separate annual license by the
- 36 commission. In addition to other requirements for charter license
- 37 eligibility, captains must show proof of participation in a
- 38 Department of Transportation approved random drug testing program
- 39 and proof of liability insurance as a charter boat captain.
- 40 Charter vessels transporting more than six (6) passengers must
- 41 show proof of applicable United States Coast Guard certification
- 42 at the time the license is issued. All other charter boat vessels
- 43 that are otherwise qualified will be issued a license restricted
- 44 to a maximum of six (6) passengers. Crew members and customers of
- 45 the licensed vessels shall not be required to purchase an
- 46 individual resident or nonresident saltwater fishing license while
- 47 sponsored by the licensed vessels. An operator of a licensed
- 48 vessel shall be required to report the number of customers to the
- 49 department as required by the commission and the information shall
- 50 be kept confidential and shall not be released, except to other
- 51 fisheries management agencies or as statistical data. All
- 52 nonresident vessels engaged in saltwater sport fishing
- 53 tournaments, not to exceed an aggregate of twenty (20) days per
- 54 calendar year, shall not be required to purchase an annual license
- 55 as provided under this subsection.
- 56 (4) The saltwater sports fishing license is required for all
- 57 recreational methods of finfish harvest.
- 58 (5) Any resident who purchases a lifetime sportsman's
- 59 license, in accordance with Section 49-7-153, shall be entitled to

- 60 fish in the marine salt waters of the state and shall be exempt
- from the purchase of a sport saltwater fishing license.
- 62 (6) Any person authorized to issue a license may collect and
- 63 retain, for each saltwater fishing license issued, the additional
- 64 fee authorized under Section 49-7-17.
- (7) The fees collected from the sale of resident and
- 66 nonresident saltwater sports fishing licenses shall be deposited
- 67 into the Seafood Fund and shall be used solely for the management
- 68 of marine resources.
- 69 (8) Participants in the Very Special Fishing Olympics are
- 70 exempt from this section.
- 71 (9) July 4 of each year is designated as "Free Saltwater
- 72 Sports Fishing Day." Any person may saltwater sport fish without
- 73 a license on the "Free Saltwater Sports Fishing Day."
- 74 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 2004.
