## HOUSE BILL NO. 1390

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE MAIL-IN VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS TO BE PLACED IN 3 ALL POLLING PLACES ON AN ELECTION DAY; TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON 4 OBTAINING AND COMPLETING A MAIL-IN VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION MUST MAIL THE APPLICATION TO HIS COUNTY REGISTRAR BEFORE HE WILL 5 6 BE REGISTERED TO VOTE; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-245, MISSISSIPPI 7 CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT PERSONS WANTING TO OBTAIN A MAIL-IN 8 VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION SHALL BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE POLLING PLACE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10
- 11 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 12
- 23-15-47. (1) Any person who is qualified to register to 13
- vote in the State of Mississippi may register to vote by mail-in 14
- 15 application in the manner prescribed in this section.
- 16 (2) The following procedure shall be used in the
- registration of electors by mail: 17
- 18 (a) Any qualified elector may register to vote by
- 19 mailing or delivering a completed mail-in application to his
- county registrar at least thirty (30) days prior to any election. 20
- 21 The postmark date of a mailed application shall be the date of
- 22 registration. The application shall be witnessed by one (1)
- 23 qualified elector in the county of the applicant's residence. The
- 24 name, address and, if available, the daytime telephone number of
- the person witnessing the application must be legibly written or 25
- printed on the application. The witness shall not be a candidate 26
- for public office as of the date of the execution of the 27
- application. Any applicant or witness is subject to the penalties 28
- 29 provided in Section 23-15-17 for false registration. Any person
- 30 who willfully swears falsely to any material matter on a mail-in

- 31 application is guilty of perjury and, upon conviction thereof,
- 32 shall be punished as provided in Section 97-9-61.
- 33 (b) Upon receipt of a mail-in application, the county
- 34 registrar shall stamp such application with the date of receipt,
- 35 and shall verify the application by contacting the applicant by
- 36 telephone, by personal contact with the applicant, or by any other
- 37 method approved by the Secretary of State. Within twenty-five
- 38 (25) days of receipt of a mail-in application, the county
- 39 registrar shall complete action on the application, including any
- 40 attempts to notify the applicant of the status of his application.
- 41 (c) If the county registrar determines that the
- 42 applicant is qualified and his application is legible and
- 43 complete, he shall mail the applicant written notification that
- 44 the application has been approved, specifying the county voting
- 45 precinct, polling place and supervisor district in which such
- 46 person shall vote. This written notification of approval
- 47 containing the specified information shall be the voter's
- 48 registration card. Said registration cards shall be provided by
- 49 the county registrar. The registrar shall assign a voter
- 50 registration number to such person, which shall be that person's
- 51 social security number if such a number is provided, and said
- 52 voter registration number shall be clearly shown on the
- 53 application and on the written notification of approval. In
- 54 mailing such written notification, the county registrar shall note
- 55 the following on the envelope: "DO NOT FORWARD." If any
- 56 registration notification form is returned as undeliverable, the
- 57 voter's registration shall be void.
- 58 (d) A mail-in application shall be rejected for any of
- 59 the following reasons:
- 60 (i) An incomplete portion of the application which
- 61 makes it impossible for the registrar to determine the eligibility
- 62 of the applicant to register;

63 (ii) A portion of the application which is 64 illegible in the opinion of the county registrar and makes it 65 impossible to determine the eligibility of the applicant to 66 register; 67 (iii) The county registrar is unable to determine, 68 from the address and information stated on the application, the precinct in which the voter should be assigned or the supervisor 69 70 district in which he is entitled to vote; (iv) The applicant is not qualified to register to 71 72 vote pursuant to Section 23-15-11; 73 (v) The registrar determines that the applicant is registered as a qualified elector of the county; 74 75 (vi) The county registrar is unable to verify the 76 application pursuant to subsection (2)(b) of this section. 77 If the mail-in application of a person is subject to rejection for any of the reasons set forth in paragraphs (d)(i) 78 through (iii) of this subsection, and it appears to the registrar 79 80 that the defect or omission is of such a minor nature and that any necessary additional information may be supplied by the applicant 81 82 over the telephone or by further correspondence, the registrar may write or call the applicant at the telephone number provided on 83 84 the application. If the registrar is able to contact the applicant by mail or telephone, he shall attempt to ascertain the 85 necessary information and if this information is sufficient for 86 87 the registrar to complete the application, the applicant shall be registered. If the necessary information cannot be obtained by 88 89 mail or telephone or is not sufficient, the registrar shall give the applicant written notice of the rejection and provide the 90 reason for such rejection. The registrar shall further inform the 91 applicant that he has a right to attempt to register by appearing 92 93 in person or by filing another mail-in application.

If a mail-in application is subject to rejection

for the reason stated in paragraph (d)(v) of this subsection and

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- 96 the "present home address" portion of the application is different
- 97 from the residence address for the applicant found in the
- 98 registration book, the mail-in application shall be deemed a
- 99 written request to transfer registration pursuant to Section
- 100 23-15-13. Subject to the time limits and other provisions of
- 101 Section 23-15-13, the registrar or the election commissioners
- 102 shall note the new residence address on his records and, if
- 103 necessary, transfer the applicant to his new precinct, advise the
- 104 applicant of his new precinct, polling place and supervisor
- 105 district, and notify the municipal clerk of any such changes on a
- 106 monthly basis.
- 107 (3) The instructions and the application form for voter
- 108 registration by mail shall be in the following form and shall
- 109 contain the following information:

## 110 "INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAIL-IN VOTER REGISTRATION

- 11. Anyone may assist you in completing the enclosed
- 112 application.
- 113 2. A registered voter of your county who is not now a
- 114 candidate for public office must complete and sign the 'Witness
- 115 Signature and Certification' portion of the enclosed application.
- 3. All required information must be supplied in legible
- 117 form.
- 118 4. The completed application must be mailed or delivered to
- 119 the registrar of your county at least thirty (30) days before an
- 120 election in order for you to be registered for that election.
- 121 Applications which are mailed must be postmarked thirty (30) days
- 122 prior to any election.
- 123 5. The penalty for conviction of false registration is a
- 124 felony punishable by a fine of not more than Five Thousand Dollars
- 125 (\$5,000.00) or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or
- 126 both."

202	(4) (a) The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish
203	without charge the necessary forms for application for voter
204	registration by mail to each county registrar, municipal clerk,
205	all public schools, each private school that requests such
206	applications, and all public libraries.
207	(b) The Secretary of State shall distribute without
208	charge sufficient forms for application for voter registration by
209	mail to the Commissioner of Public Safety, who shall distribute
210	such forms to each driver's license examining and renewal station
211	in the state, and shall ensure that the forms are regularly
212	available to the public at such stations.
213	(c) Bulk quantities of forms for application for voter
214	registration by mail shall be furnished by the Secretary of State
215	to any person or organization. The Secretary of State shall
216	charge a person or organization the actual cost he incurs in
217	providing bulk quantities of forms for application for voter
218	registration to such person or organization.
219	(5) The originals of completed mail-in applications shall
220	remain on file in the office of the county registrar in accordance
221	with Section 23-15-113. Nothing in this section shall preclude
222	having applications on microfilm or microfiche.
223	(6) If the reply to question $5(c)$ above is affirmative, the
224	county registrar shall forward notice of registration, a duplicate
225	copy of the application for registration, and any changes to such
226	registration when they occur, either by certified mail to the
227	clerk of the municipality indicated in the present residence
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228 address stated in answer to Question 5(c) above or by personal 229 delivery to such clerk, provided that a numbered receipt is signed 230 by such clerk in return for the described documents. Upon receipt 231 of the copy of the application for registration or changes to such 232 registration, and if a review of same indicates that the applicant 233 meets all the criteria necessary to qualify as a municipal 234 elector, then the clerk of said municipality shall register the applicant as a municipal elector and make a determination of the 235 236 municipal voting precinct in which the person making the 237 application shall be required to vote. The clerk shall send this 238 municipal voting precinct information by United States first-class mail, postage prepaid, to such person at the address provided on 239 240 the application. Any and all mailing costs incurred by the county 241 registrar or the clerk of the municipality in effectuating this 242 subsection shall be paid by the governing authority of such 243 municipality. If a review of the copy of the application for 244 registration or changes to such registration indicates that the 245 applicant is not qualified to vote in said municipality, the clerk of said municipality shall deny such application and notify 246 247 applicant.

- registrar or clerk shall send written notice of this new registration by regular United States mail to the registrar or clerk of the county stated in Question 8 as the voter's previous place of registration. The information shall include the complete name, address and age of the voter and shall include the social security number of such voter if it has been previously supplied. The election commission of the voter's previous place of registration shall be responsible for having such voter's name erased from the appropriate registration book and pollbook.
- 258 (8) Mail-in voter registration applications shall be placed
  259 in all polling places on an election day and shall be distributed
  260 to any person requesting a mail-in voter registration application.

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- 261 Persons obtaining a mail-in voter registration application must
- 262 mail the application to his county registrar as provided in
- 263 subsection (2)(a) of this section before he will be registered to
- 264 vote.
- 265 **SECTION 2.** Section 23-15-245, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 266 amended as follows:
- 267 23-15-245. (1) It shall be the duty of the manager
- 268 designated as bailiff to be present at the voting place, and to
- 269 take such steps as will accomplish the purpose of his appointment,
- 270 and he shall have full power to do so, and he may summon to his
- 271 aid all persons present at the voting place. A space thirty (30)
- 272 feet in every direction from the polls, or the room in which the
- 273 election is held, shall be kept open and clear of all persons
- 274 except the election officers and two (2) challengers of good
- 275 conduct and behavior, selected by each party to detect and
- 276 challenge illegal voters; and the electors shall approach the
- 277 polls from one direction, line, door or passage, and depart in
- 278 another as nearly opposite as convenient.
- (2) Any person wanting to obtain a mail-in voter
- 280 registration application shall be allowed to enter the polling
- 281 place to obtain a mail-in voter registration application, and
- 282 after he has obtained an application, he shall depart immediately
- 283 from the polling place. The mail-in voter registration
- 284 applications shall be distributed by the manager. Mail-in voter
- 285 registration applications shall be placed in all polling places on
- 286 an election day and shall be distributed as authorized in Section
- 287 23-15-47(8).
- 288 **SECTION 3.** The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 289 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 290 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 291 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 292 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the

- 293 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 294 extended.
- 295 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 296 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 297 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
