HOUSE BILL NO. 1392

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-7-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 REVISE FEES CHARGED IN JUSTICE COURT; TO AMEND SECTION 25-7-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING SECTIONS; 3 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 25-7-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 25-7-25. Costs and fees in the justice court shall be 8 9 charged as follows and shall be paid in advance to the clerk of 10 the justice court in accordance with the provisions of Section 9-11-10: 11 (a) A uniform total fee in all civil cases, whether 12 contested or uncontested, which shall include all services in 13 connection therewith, except as hereinafter stated, each... \$30.00 14 (b) For more than one (1) defendant, for service of 15 process on each defendant..... 5.00 16 17 (C) After final judgment has been enrolled, further proceedings involving levy of execution on judgments, and 18 19 attachment and garnishment proceedings..... 15.00 (d) For all services in connection with the issuance of 20 21 a peace bond..... 25.00 (e) For celebrating a marriage, and certificate 22 23 thereof 10.00 24 (f) Commission to take depositions..... 5.00 Appeal with proceedings and bond..... 25 5.00 (q) 26 (h) A clerk's fee to be collected in all criminal cases in which the defendant is convicted, as follows: 27

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(i) For all violations in Title 63 other than 28 29 driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or reckless driving..... 30 5.00 31 (ii) All other criminal cases..... 25.00 32 (i) In addition to the salary provided for in 33 subsection (1) of Section 25-3-36, each justice court judge may receive a fee of not more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for 34 each marriage ceremony he performs in the courtroom or offices of 35 the justice court at any time the courtroom or offices are open to 36 the public. This fee shall be paid by the parties to the 37 38 marriage. Each justice court judge may receive money or gratuities for marriage ceremonies performed outside of and away 39 40 from the courtroom and the offices of the justice court, that the parties to the marriage request to have performed at any time the 41 courtroom or offices of the justice court are closed. These 42 monies or gratuities, in an amount agreed upon by the parties to 43 44 the marriage, are not considered fees for the justice court and 45 are not subject to the requirements set forth in the provisions of Section 9-11-10. 46 47 (j) In addition to the salary provided for in

48 <u>subsection (1) of Section 25-3-36, each justice court judge shall</u> 49 <u>receive a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) in all civil cases filed in</u> 50 the justice court.

51 SECTION 2. Section 25-3-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 52 amended as follows:

25-3-36. (1) From and after October 1, 1998, every justice 53 54 court judge shall receive as full compensation, except as provided under Section 25-7-25, for his or her services and in lieu of any 55 and all other fees, costs or compensation heretofore authorized 56 57 for such justice court judge, an annual salary based upon the 58 population of his or her county according to the 1990 federal 59 decennial census; however, no justice court judge shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section to be paid the 60 *HR03/R1900* H. 61 justice court judge based upon the population of the county 62 according to the 1980 federal decennial census. The amount of 63 which salary shall be determined as follows:

(a) In counties with a population of more than two
hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-six Thousand Two
Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$46,299.00).

(b) In counties with a population of more than one
hundred fifty thousand (150,000) but not more than two hundred
thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-two Thousand Five Hundred
Four Dollars (\$42,504.00).

(c) In counties with a population of more than seventy-five thousand (75,000) but not more than one hundred fifty thousand (150,000), a salary of Thirty-eight Thousand Seven Hundred Nine Dollars (\$38,709.00).

75 (d) In counties with a population of more than 76 forty-nine thousand (49,000) but not more than seventy-five 77 thousand (75,000), a salary of Thirty-three Thousand Three Hundred 78 Ninety-six Dollars (\$33,396.00).

(e) In counties with a population of more than thirty-four thousand (34,000) but not more than forty-nine thousand (49,000), a salary of Twenty-eight Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-two Dollars (\$28,842.00).

83 (f) In counties with a population of more than 84 twenty-four thousand five hundred (24,500) but not more than 85 thirty-four thousand (34,000), a salary of Twenty-seven Thousand 86 Three Hundred Twenty-four Dollars (\$27,324.00).

(g) In counties with a population of more than
twenty-one thousand (21,000) but not more than twenty-four
thousand five hundred (24,500), a salary of Twenty-four Thousand
Two Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$24,288.00).

91 (h) In counties with a population of more than sixteen92 thousand five hundred (16,500) but not more than twenty-one

95 (i) In counties with a population of more than twelve 96 thousand (12,000) but not more than sixteen thousand five hundred 97 (16,500), a salary of Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixteen 98 Dollars (\$18,216.00).

99 (j) In counties with a population of more than eight 100 thousand (8,000) but not more than twelve thousand (12,000), a 101 salary of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).

102 (k) In counties with a population of eight thousand
103 (8,000) or less, a salary of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00).

104 The board of supervisors of any county having two (2) 105 judicial districts and two (2) justice court judges for the county 106 shall pay the justice court judges an amount equal to that 107 hereinabove provided for judges in the next higher population 108 category per year, if said justice court judges maintain regular 109 office hours and are personally present in the office they 110 maintain for at least thirty (30) hours per week. In any county having a population greater than eight thousand (8,000) but less 111 112 than eight thousand five hundred (8,500) according to the 1990 federal decennial census and in which U.S. Highway 61 and 113 114 Mississippi Highway 4 intersect, the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay such justice court judges an additional amount 115 not to exceed the sum of Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Fifty 116 117 Dollars (\$11,550.00) per year, payable beginning April 1, 1997. 118 In any county having a population greater than ten thousand 119 (10,000) but less than ten thousand five hundred (10,500) according to the 1990 federal decennial census and in which 120 Mississippi Highway 3 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, the 121 122 board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay such justice 123 court judges an additional amount not to exceed One Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,450.00) per year, payable beginning 124 125 April 1, 1997. twenty-four thousand seven hundred (24,700) and less than twenty-four thousand nine hundred (24,900), according to the 1990 federal census, wherein Mississippi Highways 15 and 16 intersect, the board of supervisors shall pay such justice court judge an additional amount equal to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per year.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this 132 section, in the event that the number of justice court judges 133 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1) is exceeded pursuant to 134 135 the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4), the aggregate of the salaries 136 paid to the justice court judges of such a county shall not exceed the amount sufficient to pay the number of justice court judges 137 138 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1) and such amount shall be 139 equally divided among those justice court judges continuing to hold office under the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4). 140

(3) From and after January 1, 1984, all fees, costs, fines 141 142 and penalties charged and collected in the justice court shall be 143 paid to the clerk of the justice court for deposit, along with monies from cash bonds and other monies which have been forfeited 144 145 in criminal cases, into the general fund of the county as provided in Section 9-11-19; and the clerk of the board of supervisors 146 147 shall be authorized and empowered, upon approval by the board of supervisors, to make disbursements and withdrawals from the 148 149 general fund of the county in order to pay any reasonable and 150 necessary expenses incurred in complying with this section, 151 including payment of the salaries of justice court judges as 152 provided by subsection (1) of this section. The provisions of 153 this subsection shall not, except as to cash bonds and other monies which have been forfeited in criminal cases, apply to 154 monies required to be deposited in the justice court clerk 155 156 clearing account as provided in Section 9-11-18, Mississippi Code 157 of 1972.

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(4) The salaries provided for in subsection (1) of this 158 159 section shall be payable monthly by warrant drawn by the clerk of 160 the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county; 161 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and 162 entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be 163 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments 164 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or 165 166 legal holiday.

167 (5) Provided, that the salary of any justice court judge 168 shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result of a 169 population change following a federal decennial census.

(6) Any justice court judge who is unable to attend and hold court by reason of being under suspension by the Commission on Judicial Performance or the Mississippi Supreme Court shall not receive a salary while under such suspension.

SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

181 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 182 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 183 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
