HOUSE BILL NO. 1397

AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY AND 1 EFFECTIVENESS OF RECONSTITUTING THE METHODS AND DELIVERY SYSTEM OF 2 3 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR LOCAL SCHOOL 4 ADMINISTRATORS AND LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS AS CURRENTLY OFFERED THROUGH THE SCHOOL EXECUTIVE MANAGEMENT INSTITUTE AND WHICH ARE 5 б REQUIRED FOR LICENSE RENEWAL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. (1) There is created a task force to study the 9 feasibility and effectiveness of reconstituting the methods and 10 delivery system of professional development and continuing 11 education for local school administrators and local school board members as currently offered through the school executive 12 13 management institute and which are required for license renewal. The task force shall make a report of its findings and 14 recommendations to the Legislature by December 1, 2004, including 15 any recommended legislation. 16 17 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following seventeen (17) members: 18 The State Superintendent of Public Education, who 19 (a) 20 will serve as chairperson of the task force; The Director of the Mississippi Association of 21 (b) 22 School Superintendents; The Director of the Mississippi School Boards 23 (C) 24 Association; 25 The Director of the Mississippi Association of (d) School Administrators; 26 27 (e) One (1) local school superintendent with an 28 extensive background in the development, implementation and

29 measurement of effectiveness of professional development, to be 30 appointed by the State Board of Education;

31 (f) One (1) educator with an extensive background in 32 the development, implementation and measurement of effectiveness 33 of professional development, to be appointed by the State Board of 34 Education;

35 (g) One (1) local high school principal, to be 36 appointed by the Governor;

37 (h) One (1) local middle school principal, to be38 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;

39 (i) One local elementary school principal, to be40 appointed by the Speaker of the House;

41 (j) The Chairman of the House of Representatives42 Education Committee; and

(k) The Chairman of the Senate Education Committee.
(3) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after
the effective date of this act. The task force shall hold its
first meeting before August 1, 2004.

The task force shall study the method, delivery, 47 (4) 48 accessibility, availability, variety, costs and effectiveness of 49 the professional development and continuing education programs 50 currently provided to local administrators and local school board members by the School Executive Management Institute and any other 51 52 professional development and continuing education programs. The 53 focus of the task force shall be on the following areas:

54 (a) To evaluate and make recommendations on all
55 components of the current professional development and continuing
56 education programs developed and implemented by the School
57 Executive Management Institute that are required for
58 recertification and license renewal for both local school
59 administrators and school board members;

60 (b) To evaluate and make recommendations on how to more 61 effectively use technology based professional development and

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64 (c) To evaluate and make recommendations on the
65 development and effectiveness of professional development and
66 continuing education offered through local school districts that
67 may be used towards licensure renewal;

(d) To evaluate and make recommendations on alternative
delivery systems and options for professional development and
continuing education; and

(e) To study and make recommendations for improvementson any other components of the current system.

73 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 74 and after July 1, 2004.
