HOUSE BILL NO. 1407

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A MISSISSIPPI CLEARINGHOUSE FOR PEOPLE 1 WITH DISABILITIES AND PROVIDE FOR ITS MEMBERSHIP; TO PRESCRIBE THE 2 3 POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE CLEARINGHOUSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following terms shall have the meaning ascribed in this section, unless the context otherwise requires: 6 7 "Clearinghouse" means the Mississippi Clearinghouse (a) 8 for People with Disabilities. "Director" means the Director of the Mississippi 9 (b) Clearinghouse for People with Disabilities. 10 "People with disabilities" means individuals who 11 (C) 12 have physical, sensory, cognitive or mental characteristics, such 13 as those listed under the definition of "handicapped person" in regular 28CFR 41.31 (b) for the implementation of Section 504 of 14 15 the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (Public Law 93-112). SECTION 2. (1) There is created the Mississippi 16 Clearinghouse for People with Disabilities to promote and 17 18 facilitate the full participation of, and the creation and assurance of equal opportunities for, all people with 19 20 disabilities. 21 (2) The goals and objectives of the clearinghouse shall 22 include, but are not limited to, or provided in any priority order, the following: 23 (a) To be a comprehensive clearinghouse of information, 24 initial point of contact and confidential case tracking service 25 26 for all people with disabilities related to potential service programs (Including contact points, eligibility criteria, service 27

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28 scope, budgets, waiting list), disability rights and relevant 29 events.

30 (b) To serve as a disability minority advocate to 31 identify the issues and concerns pertaining to the rights, needs 32 and capabilities of all persons with disabilities and to work to 33 empower those individuals to take as much control of their own 34 lives as possible.

35 (c) To collect, analyze and synthesize
36 disability-related data (e.g., numbers and types of disability, in
37 the state, their economic/school/employment/long-term care status)
38 for use by state agencies, universities and colleges, disability
39 organizations and private citizens.

(d) To advise the Governor, the Legislature, the Mississippi congressional delegation, state agencies, the business community, organized labor and other public and private groups and the general public on disability issues and concerns, and to make recommendations to address those identified matters, with emphasis on increasing opportunities for independence and employment.

46 (e) To coordinate and conduct public relations
47 activities to spotlight the skills and capabilities of people with
48 disabilities to emphasize the actual and potential contributions
49 of people with disabilities.

50 (f) To establish such relationships with state 51 agencies, especially those that serve the disability community, 52 consumer/advocacy groups, local governments, private industry, 53 educational institutions, labor and other private organizations, 54 as may be needed to enhance equal opportunities for persons with 55 disabilities.

(g) To submit an annual report to the Governor and the
Legislature that reflects input form the Sate Department of
Education, State Department of Health, Department of Human
Services, Division of Medicaid, State Department of Mental Health,
State Department of Rehabilitation Services, State Independent
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61 Living Council, Centers For Independent Living and disability62 support and advocacy organizations. The report will provide:

63 (i) Recommendations to address the unmet needs of64 people with disabilities in Mississippi;

65 (ii) An overall state government/private sector
66 service overview of programs and services for people with
67 disabilities in Mississippi;

68 (iii) Information on public and private groups
69 that are providing equal opportunities for persons with
70 disabilities.

(h) To carry out activities assigned by the
clearinghouse, to further the mission of the clearinghouse and the
quality of life of citizens with disabilities.

74 The clearinghouse will be administered by the (3) 75 Mississippi Coalition for Citizens With Disabilities (MCPD). the 76 director of the MCPD will serve as the MCPD Director and may 77 employ necessary support staff, not to exceed four (4) persons. 78 The Department of Finance and Administration may contract with The staffing of the clearinghouse also may be supplemented 79 MCPD. 80 by use of interns and volunteers from the community. The clearinghouse staff shall use the following classifications for 81 82 selection: The director shall be paid according to the job classification of a Division Director II as defined by the State 83 Personnel Board. The director shall have a least ten (10) years 84 experience in nongovernmental disability advocacy, and at least 85 five (5) years experience in disability advocacy management. Any 86 87 administration staff shall meet the qualifications and be paid according to the job classification of a Division Director I as 88 defined by the State Personnel Board. Any secretarial staff shall 89 meet the qualifications and be paid according to the job 90 91 classification of an administrative assistant IV as defined by the 92 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

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94 Health, Department of Human Services, Division of Medicaid, State
95 Department of Mental Health and State Department of Rehabilitation
96 Services shall assist the clearinghouse to carry out its work.
97 These representatives shall provide the clearinghouse resources to
98 facilitate their planning and coordinating efforts.

99 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 100 and after July 1, 2004.
