## HOUSE BILL NO. 1421

AN ACT TO CODIFY NEW CODE SECTION 73-39-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE 1 2 OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO CERTIFY ANIMAL CONTROL AGENCIES TO UTILIZE CERTAIN CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES FOR THE HUMANE DESTRUCTION OF ANIMALS AND TO CERTIFY 3 4 AND PRESCRIBE QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFIED ANIMAL EUTHANASIA 5 б TECHNICIANS (CAET) TO PERFORM EUTHANASIA OF ANIMALS; TO AMEND 7 SECTION 73-39-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE 8 MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO ADOPT RULES IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 11 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section 73-39-43, Mississippi Code of 1972: 12

73-39-43. (1) For purposes of this section, the following 13 terms shall have the meanings ascribed herein, unless the context 14 15 clearly indicates otherwise:

16 (a) "Certified animal control agency" means a federal, county or municipal animal shelter, dog pound or animal control 17 agency, private humane society, state, county or municipal law 18 enforcement agency, or any combination thereof, which temporarily 19 20 houses stray, unwanted or injured animals and which is certified 21 pursuant to the provisions of this section.

(b) "Certified animal euthanasia technician (CAET)" 22 23 means a person who is instructed and authorized by the board in 24 methods of humanly euthanizing animals by injecting lethal drugs, in proper security precautions and in proper record keeping and 25 who is employed by a certified animal control agency that is 26 authorized by the Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine to 27 perform euthanasia on animals with approved scheduled substances. 28 29 (c) "Board" means the Mississippi Board of Veterinary

30 Medicine.

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31 (d) "Sodium pentobarbital" means a compound prepared or 32 purchased solely as an euthanasia solution for animals.

The Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine shall 33 (2) (a) 34 adopt rules providing for the issuance of permits for the 35 purchase, possession and use of sodium pentobarbital. The rules 36 shall set forth guidelines for the proper storage and handling of the substances and other provisions as may be necessary to ensure 37 38 that these drugs are used solely for the purpose set forth in this The rules shall also provide for an application or 39 section. inspection fee and a renewal fee at set intervals. 40

41 Upon certification by the board that the applying (b) 42 agency meets the qualifications set forth in the rules, a permit 43 shall be issued.

44 The board may revoke or suspend the permit upon the (C) determination that the permittee fails to follow the rules of the 45 board regarding proper storage and handling or use of approved 46 47 euthanasia substances.

48 (3) (a) Euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control agency may be performed only by a licensed veterinarian, including 49 50 a licensed veterinary technician employed by and functioning under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian, or a certified 51 52 animal euthanasia technician as provided by law. A certified animal control agency which employs a certified animal euthanasia 53 technician may purchase, possess and administer sodium 54 55 pentobarbital. Sodium pentobarbital approved by the board shall be the only drug used for the euthanasia of animals in a certified 56 57 animal control agency. Upon submission of a complete application and payment of a fee established by the board, the Board of 58 59 Veterinary Examiners shall issue to any person whom it determines to be qualified a certificate for the person to function as a 60 61 certified animal euthanasia specialist.

62 (b) No officer or agent of a certified animal control agency or veterinarian acting in good faith and with due care 63

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64 pursuant to this act may be held liable either criminally or 65 civilly for that act, nor shall any civil or criminal liability 66 attach to the employer of the officer, agent or veterinarian.

67 (c) A court order shall not be necessary to carry out68 this section.

69 (4) Any person who violates this act shall be guilty of a 70 misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not 71 exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment in the 72 county jail for a term not exceeding six (6) months, or both.

73 (5) Notwithstanding any provision of this section, the 74 Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine shall issue a certified animal euthanasia technician certificate to any person who (a) has 75 76 not less than five (5) years' experience in performing euthanasia 77 on animals for a federal, municipal or county animal control 78 shelter, (b) is presently performing euthanasia on animals for a 79 federal, municipal or county animal control shelter and (c) makes 80 application to the board for the certificate during the period from July 1, 2004, through July 31, 2004. The board shall furnish 81 persons seeking certification under this section an application 82 83 form upon request. The applicant's previous experience and 84 current employment at a federal, municipal or county animal 85 control shelter must be documented in writing by the owner, management, licensee or governing authorities in charge of the 86 87 animal control shelter and included with the application to the 88 board.

89 SECTION 2. Section 73-39-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 90 amended as follows:

91 73-39-9. The board shall elect from their members a 92 president, vice president and secretary-treasurer. The board is 93 authorized:

94 (a) To adopt reasonable rules governing the practice of 95 veterinary medicine as are necessary to enable it to carry out and 96 make effective the purpose and intent of this chapter. Such rules H. B. No. 1421 \*HR07/R2076\* 04/HR07/R2076 PAGE 3 (MS\HS) 97 shall be adopted and promulgated in accordance with the provisions98 of this chapter.

99 (b) To adopt rules of professional conduct appropriate 100 to establish and maintain a high standard of integrity, skills and 101 practice in the profession of veterinary medicine. In prescribing 102 such rules of professional conduct, the board may be guided by the 103 principles of veterinary medical ethics adopted by the American 104 Veterinary Medical Association and the Mississippi Veterinary 105 Medical Association.

106 (c) To have its rules printed which shall be107 distributed to all licensed veterinarians.

108 (d) To bring proceedings in courts for the enforcement109 of this chapter or any rules made pursuant thereto.

To hold at least one (1) regular meeting on the 110 (e) third Tuesday in June each year in the City of Jackson at such 111 time and location as fixed by the board, for the purpose of 112 conducting examinations of applicants for license to practice 113 114 veterinary medicine, the election of officers and to consider any other business that may properly come before the board. 115 Other 116 meetings may be held upon the call of the president and secretary of the board. 117

(f) To pass upon the qualifications of applicants for a license to practice veterinary medicine in this state, or for a certificate as an animal technician.

(g) To prescribe the subjects, character, manner, time and place of holding examinations and the filing of applications for examinations and to conduct the examinations.

124 (h) To issue temporary permits to practice to duly125 qualified applicants which shall be signed by the secretary.

(i) To provide for, regulate and require all persons licensed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter to renew their license annually; to require as a condition precedent to such annual renewal the payment of the annual renewal fee as H. B. No. 1421 \*HR07/R2076\* 04/HR07/R2076

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provided herein; to issue annual renewal licenses to such persons 130 131 and to suspend or revoke the license of such persons who fail, 132 refuse or neglect to renew same or pay such fees. 133 To conduct investigations and hearings upon (j) 134 complaints calling for discipline of a licensee or applicant for 135 license. (k) 136 To take testimony on any matter under its jurisdiction and any member thereof may administer oaths. 137

(1) To issue summons and subpoenas, including subpoenas duces tecum, for any witness in connection with any matter within the jurisdiction of the board, which shall be signed by either the president or the secretary-treasurer of the board.

142 (m) To adopt such forms as it may deem necessary.

143 (n) To adopt rules and regulate the certification of

144 <u>animal control agencies and animal euthanasia technicians pursuant</u> 145 to Section 73-39-43.

146 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 147 and after July 1, 2004.
