## HOUSE BILL NO. 1531

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-501, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT VEHICLES LOADED WITH TIMBER OR ANY OTHER FORESTRY 3 PRODUCTS ON ANY PUBLIC ROAD, STREET OR HIGHWAY IN THIS STATE SHALL 4 NOT OPERATE AT A SPEED GREATER THAN TEN MILES PER HOUR LESS THAN 5 THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT FOR OTHER VEHICLES; TO AMEND SECTION 6 63-5-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR THE 7 OPERATION OF CERTAIN VEHICLES WITHOUT PROPERLY SECURING THEIR 8 LOADS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-501, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11 amended as follows:

63-3-501. No person shall operate a vehicle on the highways
of the state at a speed greater than sixty-five (65) miles per
hour.

The Mississippi Transportation Commission may, in its 15 discretion, by order duly entered on its minutes, increase the 16 speed restrictions on any portion of the Interstate Highway System 17 18 provided such speed restrictions are not increased to more than 19 seventy (70) miles per hour. The commission may likewise increase the speed limit to seventy (70) miles per hour on controlled 20 21 access highways with four (4) or more lanes. However, vehicles loaded with timber or any other forestry products on any public 22 road, street or highway in this state shall not operate at a speed 23 greater than ten (10) miles per hour less than the posted speed 24 25 limit for other vehicles.

26 SECTION 2. Section 63-5-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
27 amended as follows:

28 63-5-19. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
29 no single vehicle, unladen or with load, shall have an overall

30 length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, in excess of forty 31 (40) feet.

32 (2) No semitrailer operating in a truck tractor-semitrailer
 33 combination and no trailer drawn by a motor vehicle shall exceed a
 34 length of fifty-three (53) feet.

35 (3) No semitrailer or trailer operating in a truck 36 tractor-semitrailer-trailer combination and no trailer operating 37 in a double trailer combination drawn by a motor vehicle shall 38 exceed a length of thirty (30) feet.

39 (4) No semitrailer or trailer combinations in excess of two
40 (2) units, excluding the towing motor vehicle, shall be allowed to
41 operate on the highways of this state.

42 (5) No motor home shall have an overall length exclusive of43 front and rear bumpers, in excess of forty-five (45) feet.

The load upon the rear vehicle of a combination of 44 (6) vehicles transporting forest or agricultural products in their 45 46 natural state shall not project more than twenty-eight (28) feet 47 beyond the rear axle of the vehicle except in the special circumstance hereinafter prescribed. If such products project 48 49 more than twenty-eight (28) feet beyond the rear axle and, due to the end use for which they are intended (such as tall utility 50 51 poles or light poles or the like), such products cannot be shortened without rendering them useless for the finished product 52 for which they have been cut, then such special circumstance may 53 54 be considered good cause for the obtaining of a permit which shall be procured pursuant to Section 63-5-51 before vehicles 55 56 transporting such products may operate. Except as otherwise 57 provided in Section 63-5-21, any vehicle transporting projecting 58 loads as described in this subsection that extend four (4) feet or 59 more beyond the rear or body of the vehicle shall operate only during daylight hours, and the load on vehicles designed to 60 61 transport forestry products shall be secured by at least two (2) 62 chains, two (2) wire ropes, or two (2) nylon straps, one (1) \*HR07/R1905\* H. 63 positioned behind the front bolster and one (1) in front of the 64 back bolster. <u>Any person who violates the provisions of this</u> 65 <u>section, is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be</u> 66 <u>subject to a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars</u> 67 <u>(\$1,000.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), by</u> 68 <u>imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year, or</u> 69 <u>both such fine and imprisonment.</u>

70 (7) Except as otherwise provided in Section 63-5-21, the 71 rear projecting load of any vehicle operating during the period 72 described under Section 63-7-11 may not extend four (4) feet or 73 more beyond the rear or body of the vehicle.

74 The length limitations on projecting loads prescribed in (8) 75 this section do not apply to a single vehicle or the rear vehicle of a combination of vehicles designed for on-farm delivery and 76 77 unloading of any agricultural product, in its natural or manufactured form, which is fitted with an auger or similar 78 79 unloading device permanently affixed to the vehicle that extends 80 no more than eight (8) feet horizontally beyond the rear or body of the vehicle provided that no portion of such device which 81 82 extends four (4) feet or more beyond the rear or body of the vehicle is less than seven (7) feet above the roadway surface. 83 84 However, any such vehicle may not be operated on the public highways, roads or streets of this state during the period 85 described under Section 63-7-11. 86

(9) A vehicle designed and especially constructed to transport raw cotton from harvest to the cotton gin may have a total overall length not to exceed fifty (50) feet whenever any such vehicle is being operated within a radius of fifty (50) miles of the vehicle's home base or its contractual customer.

92 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 93 and after July 1, 2004.
