HOUSE BILL NO. 1541

- 1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE JUVENILE JUSTICE COMMUNITY SERVICES
- 2 ADVISORY BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF STUDYING AND MAKING
- 3 RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES AVAILABLE
- 4 TO AT-RISK YOUTH; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 WHEREAS, research indicates that the best hope for preventing
- 6 child abuse, neglect, juvenile crime, and for reducing the rate of
- 7 recidivism in juvenile delinquency and later crime, is to employ a
- 8 comprehensive strategy involving a range of prevention,
- 9 assessment, early intervention, treatment services, as well as
- 10 progressive sanctions: NOW, THEREFORE,
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 12 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established the Juvenile Justice
- 13 Community Services Advisory Board, the duties of which shall be to
- 14 study and make recommendations concerning the community based
- 15 services available to Mississippi's at-risk youth.
- 16 (2) The advisory board shall consist of twelve (12) members
- 17 as follows:
- 18 (a) The Director of the Office of Youth Services of the
- 19 Department of Human Services or his or her designee;
- 20 (b) The State Superintendent of Public Education or
- 21 his or her designee;
- 22 (c) The Executive Director of the Department of Mental
- 23 Health or his designee;
- 24 (d) One (1) youth court counselor appointed by the
- 25 Mississippi Council of Youth Court Judges;
- 26 (e) One (1) representative from the Mississippi
- 27 Schoolhouse to Jailhouse Coalition;

- 28 (f) One (1) representative from the Mississippi
- 29 National Association for the Advancement of Colored People
- 30 (NAACP);
- 31 (g) One (1) representative from Citizens for Quality
- 32 Education;
- 33 (h) One (1) representative from Citizens for a Better
- 34 Greenville;
- 35 (i) One (1) representative from Junior Achievement of
- 36 Mississippi, Inc.;
- 37 (j) One (1) youth who has received community based
- 38 services that are currently available to Mississippi's at-risk
- 39 youth, appointed by the chairman of the House of Representatives
- 40 Juvenile Justice Committee; and
- 41 (k) Two (2) parents of youth who have received
- 42 community based services that are currently available to
- 43 Mississippi's at-risk youth, appointed by the Chairman of the
- 44 House of Representatives Juvenile Justice Committee.
- 45 (3) The advisory board shall study and make recommendations
- 46 related to the following:
- 47 (a) The manner in which youth are refereed to the youth
- 48 court system;
- 49 (b) The availability and quality of delinquency
- 50 prevention, assessment, early intervention and treatment services
- 51 for at-risk youth, including adolescent offender programs, drug
- 52 court programs and alternative schools;
- 53 (c) The alternatives to incarceration available to
- 54 youth courts for delinquent youth who do not pose a threat to the
- 55 public; and
- of (d) Other related issues approved by a majority of
- 57 advisory board members.
- 58 (4) At its first meeting, the advisory board shall elect a
- 59 chairperson and vice chairperson from its membership and shall
- 60 adopt rules for transacting its business and keeping its records.

- 61 (5) If sufficient funds are available to the advisory board
- 62 for that purpose, members of the advisory board may receive
- 63 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred while engaged in
- 64 official business of the advisory board in accordance with Section
- 65 25-3-41.
- 66 (6) Before December 1, 2004, the advisory board shall make a
- 67 report of its work and recommendations, and it shall submit a copy
- of the report to the House of Representatives Juvenile Justice
- 69 Committee and the Governor.
- 70 (7) After the presentation of its report to the Legislature
- 71 and the Governor, the advisory board shall be dissolved.
- 72 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 73 and after July 1, 2004.
