HOUSE BILL NO. 1585

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-1-28, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THAT THE ELECTRONIC BENEFIT TRANSFER (EBT) CARDS USED IN 3 THE FOOD STAMP PROGRAM OR THE TANF PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE ON THE 4 FACE OF THE CARD A PHOTOGRAPH OF THE PERSON TO WHOM THE CARD WAS 5 ISSUED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 43-1-28, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

9 43-1-28. (1) The Department of Human Services shall develop an on-line electronic benefit transfer (EBT) system for the food 10 11 stamp program in Mississippi as an alternative to issuing food stamp coupons. The EBT system developed by the department under 12 13 this section shall (a) provide that food stamp benefits are stored 14 in and issued from a central computer data base and are electronically accessed by households at the point of sale through 15 16 the use of reusable magnetic-stripe plastic cards; and (b) meet all requirements and standards specified in 7 USCS Section 2016(i) 17 and the rules and regulations issued under that provision for 18 19 approval by the Secretary of the United States Department of 20 Agriculture.

(2) The department shall develop the EBT system and shall 21 submit an application to the Secretary of the United States 22 Department of Agriculture for approval of the system. After the 23 24 EBT system has been approved, the department shall implement and 25 operate the system as a pilot project in a county selected by the department. After the pilot project has been evaluated and 26 27 approved by the United States Department of Agriculture, and subject to the availability of funds specifically appropriated 28

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29 therefor, the system may be expanded statewide at a rate

30 determined by the Executive Director of the Department of Human 31 Services. The system shall be expanded and implemented statewide 32 not later than October 1, 2002.

33 (3) The department shall seek to obtain the maximum amount 34 of federal financial participation available to fund the cost of 35 administering the EBT system.

The Department of Human Services may develop an on-line 36 (4) electronic benefit transfer (EBT) system for the Temporary 37 38 Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program in Mississippi as an 39 alternative to issuing cash or voucher payments. The EBT system developed by the department under this section shall (a) provide 40 41 that TANF benefits are stored in and issued from a central computer data base and are electronically accessed; and (b) meet 42 all requirements and standards specified in the Personal 43 Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 44 (Public Law 104-193), and the rules and regulations issued under 45 46 that act. The department shall seek to obtain the maximum amount of federal financial participation available to fund the cost of 47 48 administering the EBT system for TANF payments.

49 (5) In order to facilitate the acquisition and deployment of 50 EBT products and services in Mississippi, the Department of Human Services (DHS) and the Mississippi Department of Information 51 Technology Services (MDITS), at their discretion, may utilize EBT 52 53 agreements from other states and/or multistate coalition agreements that allow other states to acquire EBT products and 54 55 services. After going through the approved ITS bidding process 56 and the state is unable to acquire an EBT contract, DHS and ITS 57 may negotiate an EBT contract with any vendor who meets DHS and ITS, EBT requirements. 58

59 (6) The EBT cards that are used in the food stamp program,
60 the TANF program, or both programs, shall include on the face of
61 the card a photograph of the person to whom the card was issued,
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62 to help the person to whom the card is presented determine if the

63 person seeking to use the card is actually the person to whom the

64 card was issued.

65 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 66 and after July 1, 2004.
