BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby authorized and approved for expenditure out 6 7 of any funds which are received by or otherwise become available 8 to the Pat Harrison Waterway District, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the district for the fiscal year 9 beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... 10 \$ 5,341,295.00. 11 12 SECTION 2. 32 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 33 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 34 Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005 35 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 36 37 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the 38 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 39 40 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 41 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 42 act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 43 44 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 45 46 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 47 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 48 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 49 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 50 51 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 52 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 53 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

54 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 55 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 56 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 57 58 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 61 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 62 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

67 **SECTION 3.** The funds authorized herein shall be used to fund 68 all operations of the agency with the following prohibitions:

69 (1) The agency shall not fill any current or future vacant70 positions;

(2) The agency shall not take any action to promote orotherwise award salary increases through reallocation,

73 reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, 74 or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions 75 except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 76 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

77 (3) The agency shall not expend funds for out-of-state
78 travel except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
79 Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

80 (4) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of or
81 contract for cellular phones, two-way radios or pagers, except for
82 support of employees in the Department of Public Safety and the
83 Bureau of Narcotics as recommended by Information Technology
84 Services or as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
85 Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

86 (5) The agency shall not expend funds to publish or87 distribute any annual reports or other publications;

(6) The agency shall not expend funds for public relation
activities regarding the functions, programs or services of the
agency except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House
Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

92 (7) The agency shall not advertise the functions, programs 93 or services of the agency except that the Mississippi Development H. B. No. 1697 *HR05/A480* 04/HR05/A480 PAGE 3 (\ST) 94 Authority is authorized to expend funds for advertising to carry 95 out the purposes of key programs administered by the authority;

96 (8) The agency shall not expend funds for staff development97 or training services;

98 (9) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of 99 new or replacement equipment or furniture, excluding lease 100 purchase payments on agreements in effect upon passage of this 101 appropriation bill, except as allowed under the provisions set 102 forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session.

SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 103 104 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 105 106 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 107 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 108 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 109 110 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 111 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following "Funds were made available for this project by the 112 language: 113 Mississippi State Legislature."

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 114 115 Pat Harrison Waterway District shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 116 117 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 118 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 119 2004. 120 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 121 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 122 during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process. 123

SECTION 6. The funds herein approved for expenditure, except and less an amount approved by the State Fiscal Officer which shall be sufficient to cover disbursements for current operations, H. B. No. 1697 *HR05/A480*

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127 shall be deposited at interest with any official depository of the 128 state at a rate of interest numerically not less than one percent 129 (1%) below the bank discount rate on United States Treasury bills 130 of comparable maturity as determined by the State Treasurer.

131 SECTION 7. The money herein approved for expenditure shall
132 be disbursed upon bank checks signed by the proper person, officer
133 or officers, in the manner provided by law.

134 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 135 and after July 1, 2004.
