4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	Treasury to the credit of the Public Service Commission Regulation
8	Fund, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi
9	Public Service Commission for the fiscal year beginning
10	July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005

12	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

32 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 33 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 34 Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005 35 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 36 37 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the 38 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 39 40 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 41 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 42 act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 43 44 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 45 46 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 47 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 48 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 49 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 50 51 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 52 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 53 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

54 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 55 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 56 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 57 58 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 59 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 60 \*HR40/A811SG\* H. B. No. 1718

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61 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 62 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

67 SECTION 3. None of the funds herein appropriated by this act 68 to the Public Service Commission shall be expended for any purpose 69 that is not actually required or necessary for performing any of 70 the powers or duties of the Mississippi Public Service Commission 71 that are authorized by the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state 72 or federal law, or rules or regulations that implement state or 73 federal law.

74 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 75 Public Service Commission shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 76 77 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 78 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 79 2004 80 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to 81 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 82 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process. 83

84 SECTION 5. In addition to all other sums herein 85 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 86 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury 87 to the credit of the Public Service Commission, for the purpose of 88 defraying the expenses of the Public Service Commission to administer the Mississippi Telephone Solicitation Act, for the 89 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... 90 91 .....\$ 169,000.00. 92 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 93 agency shall provide a report reflecting Fiscal Year 2004 usage of

No. 1718 04/HR40/A811SG PAGE 3 (\ST\BD) 94 wireless communication devices which shall include cellular 95 phones, two-way radios, pagers, or any other means of wireless 96 communications to the Chairman of the House Appropriations 97 Committee, the Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, 98 and the State Auditor by September 1, 2004. The report shall 99 contain, but not be limited to, the following:

100 (1) The number of wireless communication devices provided to101 employees by the agency;

102 (2) The annual cost of usage of wireless communication
103 devices by each employee of the agency who is issued a wireless
104 communication device;

105 (3) Separate justification of the usage of wireless 106 communication devices by those employees issued wireless 107 communication devices; and

108 (4) To determine whether quantifiable benefits are 109 associated with the utilization of wireless communications and 110 whether such service provides more efficient or effective service 111 delivery.

SECTION 7. Contingent upon passage of House Bill No. 1279, 112 113 2004 Regular Session, the Public Service Commission shall transfer 114 all employees, equipment, inventory and resources of the 115 commission employed and used as law enforcement personnel to the Department of Transportation on July 1, 2004. The transfer of 116 personnel shall be commensurate with the number and classification 117 118 of positions allocated to that law enforcement. The transfer shall also include direct support, clerical, data processing and 119 120 communications positions allocated to that law enforcement.

SECTION 8. If no general legislation is passed during the 2004 Regular Session transferring the Public Service Commission Motor Carrier Regulation Program to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, then the Public Service Commission shall be authorized to escalate an amount not to exceed Four Million Six Hundred Seventeen Thousand One Hundred Sixty-nine Dollars

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127 (\$4,617,169.00) and sixty (60) PINs for the purpose of defraying 128 the law enforcement activities of the Mississippi Public Service 129 Commission.

130 SECTION 9. If no general legislation is passed during the 131 2004 Regular Session transferring the Public Service Commission 132 Motor Carrier Regulation Program to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, then the Public Service Commission shall have the 133 134 authority to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from participation in drug seizure activities not to exceed Fifty 135 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), in accordance with the rules and 136 137 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 10. If no general legislation is passed during the 138 139 2004 Regular Session transferring the Public Service Commission 140 Motor Carrier Regulation Program to the Mississippi Department of 141 Transportation, then with the funds provided herein, overtime may be paid to PSC-Enforcement Office Regulated Carrier positions, the 142 PSC-Enforcement Officer Chief position, PSC-Enforcement Officer 143 144 District Supervisor positions, PSC-Special Projects Officer IV positions, and PSC-Training Director positions. 145

146 SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 147 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 148 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 149 150 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 151 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. This act shall take effect and be in force from 152 SECTION 12. 153 and after July 1, 2004.
