BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 8 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Health for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... 9 .....\$ 26,836,178.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by 14 15 or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... 17 18 .....\$ 213,277,095.00. SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 19 20 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 21 Treasury to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Board of Health for 22 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005. 23 .....\$ 13,488,785.00. 24 The above funds shall be allocated as follows: 25 26 Maternal and Child Health Care Program.....\$1,334,579.00 27

33 It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the Five 34 Million Seven Hundred Nineteen Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$5,719,626.00) authorized herein for the Trauma Care 35 System shall be expended to the benefit of any hospital located 36 outside the boundaries of the State of Mississippi, unless 37 38 otherwise excepted in this paragraph. Further, unless otherwise excepted in this paragraph, no such out-of-state hospital shall be 39 40 authorized to receive such funds until such time as the amount appropriated for such purpose shall reach an amount of Eight 41 Million Dollars (\$8,000,000.00) or more. Funds shall be expended 42 by the Mississippi Department of Health for distribution to the 43 Regional Medical Center at Memphis, located in Memphis, Tennessee, 44 45 for their participation in the Trauma Care System.

46 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 47 Sections 1, 2 and 3, not more than the amounts set forth below 48 shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 49 expenditure:

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 70 71 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 72 73 Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 74 75 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 76 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 77 78 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 79 80 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 81 82 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 83 84 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 85 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 86 87 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" 88 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 89 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 90 91 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 92 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 93 \*HR05/A301\* H. The State 95 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 96 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 97 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 98 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 99 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 100 appropriated level.

101 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 102 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 103 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 104 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

105 SECTION 5. The funds authorized herein shall be used to fund 106 all operations of the agency with the following prohibitions:

107 (1) The agency shall not fill any current or future vacant108 positions;

109 (2) The agency shall not take any action to promote or
110 otherwise award salary increases through reallocation,
111 reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder,

or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

(3) The agency shall not expend funds for out-of-state travel except as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

(4) The agency shall not expend funds for the purchase of or contract for cellular phones, two-way radios or pagers, except for support of employees in the Department of Public Safety and the Bureau of Narcotics as recommended by Information Technology Services or as allowed under the provisions set forth in House Bill No. 1279, 2004 Regular Legislative Session;

141 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 142 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members 143 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 144 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 145 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 146 147 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 148 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following 149 150 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." 151

152 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Health shall maintain complete accounting and 153 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 154 155 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 156 157 2004. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 158 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall be submitted to \*HR05/A301\* H. B. No. 1735 04/HR05/A301 PAGE 5 (\st)

159 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 160 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 161 during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process.

SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2006.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Health may escalate any special funds and positions not to exceed Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00). Such escalation shall be submitted to and approved by the Department of Finance and Administration in the manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

206 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 207 Department of Health shall have the authority to expend any 208 special funds collected or otherwise available, notwithstanding 209 any restrictions in the general law or statutes earmarking said funds for a particular use, that are in excess of the amounts 210 211 needed for the purpose of such fund, for the purpose of providing 212 maternal and child health, family planning and disease control 213 services.

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that with the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such vaccinations through job related exposure.

SECTION 12. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural Water System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in H. B. No. 1735 \*HR05/A301\*

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that in the event that there are insufficient Child Care Development Block Grant Funds, then the Department of Health shall maintain the Child Care Licensure Program at the same level that the program was in Fiscal Year 1993 using any other funds.

235 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of 236 237 Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. 238 These 239 funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no 240 later than July 31, 2004. The State Department of Health shall 241 make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the 242 Department of Human Services.

SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 243 244 State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated in Section 245 246 1 and allocated in Section 4 for providing the oil known as 247 "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents 248 249 over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the 250 251 cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed 252 pathology and biannual MRI exams.
