HOUSE BILL NO. 1839

- AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 878, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1990,
- 2.
- AS LAST AMENDED BY CHAPTER 958, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 2000, TO EXTEND THE DATE UPON WHICH THE HATTIESBURG TOURISM COMMISSION IS 3
- 4 REPEALED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Chapter 878, Local and Private Laws of 1990, as 6
- amended by Chapter 1013, Local and Private Laws of 1995, as 7
- amended by Chapter 947, Local and Private Laws of 1997, as amended 8
- 9 by Chapter 958, Local and Private Laws of 2000, is amended as
- 10 follows:
- Section 1. The following terms as used in this act shall 11
- have the meanings herein ascribed unless the context otherwise 12
- 13 clearly requires:
- (a) "Hotel" or "motel" means a place of lodging that at 14
- any one time will accommodate transient quests on a daily or 15
- 16 weekly basis, excluding hotels or motels with ten (10) or less
- overnight rental units; 17
- "Commission" means the Hattiesburg Tourism 18 (b)
- 19 Commission;
- "City" means the City of Hattiesburg. 2.0
- 21 Section 2. There is hereby created and established the
- Hattiesburg Tourism Commission. 22
- 23 Section 3. (1) The commission shall consist of the
- following seven (7) members appointed by the mayor and ratified by 24
- the city council: 25
- 26 Two (2) members of the hotel/motel industry;
- (b) One (1) member either of the Chamber of Commerce or 2.7
- the Economic Development Foundation; 28

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- 29 (c) One (1) member representing the University of
- 30 Southern Mississippi; and
- 31 (d) Three (3) members who serve at large.
- 32 (2) The commission shall be appointed within sixty (60) days
- 33 following the adoption of a resolution pursuant to passage of this
- 34 act for the following terms:
- 35 (a) Two (2) members for a term of one (1) year;
- 36 (b) Two (2) members for a term of two (2) years;
- 37 (c) One (1) member for a term of three (3) years;
- 38 (d) One (1) member for a term of four (4) years; and
- (e) One (1) member for a term of five (5) years.
- Thereafter, appointments will be made on a staggered basis
- 41 for a five-year period.
- 42 (3) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 43 compensation, shall elect officers and adopt rules and
- 44 regulations, and shall fix a regular meeting date, but may provide
- 45 for special meetings. The commission shall keep minutes of its
- 46 proceedings as are necessary to carry out its responsibilities. A
- 47 quorum of the commission shall consist of four (4) members.
- 48 (4) Any member of the commission may be disqualified and
- 49 removed from office for any one (1) of the following reasons:
- 50 (a) Conviction of a felony; or
- 51 (b) Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings
- 52 without just cause.
- 53 (5) Before entering on the duties of the office appointed,
- 54 each member of the commission shall enter into and give bond to be
- 55 approved by the Secretary of State of the State of Mississippi, in
- 56 the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) conditioned on the
- 57 satisfactory performance of his duties. This bond premium shall
- 58 be paid from the Tourism Commission's funds and payable to the
- 59 City of Hattiesburg in the event of a breech thereof. Suit may be
- 60 brought by the city for benefit of the commission.

- 61 Section 4. The commission shall have jurisdiction and
- 62 authority over all matters relating to establishing, promoting and
- 63 developing tourism in the city and shall be authorized:
- 64 (a) To acquire, own, furnish, equip, staff and operate
- 65 any and all facilities and equipment necessary or usable in the
- 66 promotion of tourism for the City of Hattiesburg;
- (b) To receive and expend revenues from any source,
- 68 including, but not limited to, private enterprise and those
- 69 revenues generated by this act;
- 70 (c) To own, lease or contract for any equipment useful
- 71 and necessary in the promotion of tourism and convention business
- 72 for the City of Hattiesburg;
- 73 (d) To sell, convey and otherwise dispose of all or any
- 74 part of its property and assets in accordance with the General
- 75 Laws of the State of Mississippi; and
- 76 (e) To have and exercise all powers necessary or
- 77 convenient to effect any and all of the purposes for which the
- 78 commission is organized, including the appointment and employment
- 79 of individuals acting on behalf of the commission.
- 80 Section 5. (1) For the purpose of providing operating funds
- 81 for the commission to promote tourism, the governing authorities
- 82 are hereby authorized, in their discretion, to levy, assess and
- 83 collect from every person, firm or corporation operating hotels
- 84 and motels in the City of Hattiesburg, and in addition to all
- other taxes now imposed, an amount not to exceed two percent (2%)
- 86 of the gross proceeds from overnight room rental, exclusive of
- 87 charges for food, telephone, laundry, beverages and similar
- 88 charges.
- 89 (2) Persons liable for the tax imposed herein shall add the
- 90 amount of the tax to the aforesaid room rentals and collect the
- 91 same.
- 92 (3) The tax collected shall be paid to the State Tax
- 93 Commission on a form prescribed in the same manner that state

- 94 sales taxes are computed, collected and paid; and the full
- 95 enforcement provisions and all other provisions of Chapter 65,
- 96 Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as necessary to
- 97 the implementation and administration of this act.
- 98 (4) The proceeds of such tax, less three percent (3%)
- 99 thereof which shall be retained by the State Tax Commission to
- 100 defray the costs of collection, shall be paid to the City of
- 101 Hattiesburg on or before the fifteenth day of the month following
- 102 the month in which collected.
- 103 (5) Proceeds of the tax shall not be considered by the City
- 104 of Hattiesburg as General Fund revenues, but shall be dedicated
- 105 solely for the purpose of carrying out the programs and activities
- 106 of the Tourism Commission.
- 107 (6) Before the taxes authorized by this act may be imposed,
- 108 the governing authorities shall adopt a resolution declaring its
- 109 intention to levy the taxes and establishing the amount of the tax
- 110 levy and the date on which the taxes initially shall be levied and
- 111 collected. The date shall be the first day of a month but not
- 112 less than forty-five (45) days from the date of adoption of the
- 113 resolution. Notice of the proposed tax levy shall be published
- 114 once each week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in a
- 115 newspaper having a general circulation in such city. The first
- 116 publication of such notice shall be made not less than twenty-one
- 117 (21) days prior to the date fixed in the resolution on which the
- 118 governing authorities propose to levy such taxes, and the last
- 119 publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to
- 120 such date. If, within the time of giving notice, twenty percent
- 121 (20%) or fifteen hundred (1500), whichever is less, of the
- 122 qualified electors of the city file a written petition against the
- 123 levy of such taxes, then such taxes shall not be levied unless
- 124 authorized by a majority of the qualified electors of such city
- 125 voting at an election to be called and held for that purpose.
- 126 Prior to the effective date of the tax levy approved as herein

- 127 provided, the governing authorities shall furnish to the Chairman
- 128 of the State Tax Commission a certified copy of the resolution
- 129 evidencing such tax levy.
- 130 Section 6. (1) This act shall take effect and be in force
- 131 from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the
- 132 Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
- 133 (2) This act shall stand repealed from and after September
- 134 30, 2011.
- 135 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 136 and after its passage.
