## HOUSE BILL NO. 1857

- AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF GREENWOOD TO EXPEND MONIES, PROVIDE IN-KIND SERVICES AND USE NONVIOLENT MUNICIPAL INMATES TO CLEAN AND MAINTAIN THE CEMETERY OF GOOD SHEPHERD AND THE MAGNOLIA CEMETERY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** (1) The governing authorities of the City of
- 7 Greenwood, in their discretion, may set aside, appropriate and
- 8 expend, out of any available funds of the municipality, a sum not
- 9 to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) in any fiscal year
- 10 and, in addition, may provide in-kind services, including the use
- 11 of county employees, equipment and supplies, for the purpose of
- 12 cleaning and maintaining the Cemetery of Good Shepherd and the
- 13 Magnolia Cemetery.
- 14 (2) In addition to the authority granted under subsection
- 15 (1) of this section, the governing authorities of the City of
- 16 Greenwood, in their discretion, may use any person who has been
- 17 convicted of a nonviolent offense and who is serving all or any
- 18 part of his sentence in the municipal jail for the purpose of
- 19 cleaning and maintaining the Cemetery of Good Shepherd and the
- 20 Magnolia Cemetery.
- 21 (3) The City of Greenwood, its employees and agents shall
- 22 not be liable for any harm caused by any act or omission in
- 23 carrying out the authority granted under this act, including
- 24 liability for any damage caused to any headstone, grave site,
- 25 fence or other appurtenance of the Cemetery of Good Shepherd or
- 26 the Magnolia Cemetery.
- 27 (4) This act shall stand repealed from and after July 1,
- 28 2007.

29 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

30 and after its passage.
