- 5 WHEREAS, primary flight training was conducted by the
- Division of Aeronautics of Tuskegee Institute, the famed school of 6
- 7 learning founded by Booker T. Washington in 1881; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the first class of all black pilots graduated on
- 9 March 7, 1942, and made up the 99th Pursuit Squadron, fighter
- pilots slated for duty in North Africa; and 10
- 11 WHEREAS, additional pilots were assigned to the 332nd Fighter
- 12 Group, which flew combat along with the 99th Squadron from bases
- in Italy; and 13
- WHEREAS, by the end of World War II, with the last class 14
- 15 graduating on June 29, 1946, a total of 926 pilots had earned
- their wings at Tuskegee; and 16
- WHEREAS, 450 Tuskegee pilots were deployed overseas for 17
- combat assignment in P-39, P-40, P-47 and P-51 aircraft, of which 18
- 66 gave the ultimate sacrifice of life in combat action and 19
- 20 another 32 became POWs; and
- WHEREAS, Mississippi is proud to have been called home to ten 21
- 22 Tuskegee Airmen, all of whom were Second Lieutenants: Leonelle A.
- 23 Bonam, Herbert E. Carter, Oliver M. Dillon, Walter M. Downs, John
- L. Hamilton, Wellington O. Irving, Eddie A. McLaurin, Luke J. 24
