HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 21

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF JAMES
2 CLIFTON EUBANKS AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND
3 FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING.

4 WHEREAS, James Clifton Eubanks, born July 19, 1945, departed
5 this earthly life on June 7, 2003, causing great sorrow and loss
6 to his family and friends; and

7 WHEREAS, a graduate of William Carey College, Mr. Eubanks was
8 a diligent and dedicated employee with the Mississippi Power
9 Company for 35 years; and

10 WHEREAS, a retired Colonel from the Mississippi Army National
11 Guard after 27 years, Mr. Eubanks was a faithful member in good
12 standing of the Oak Grove Baptist Church; and

13 WHEREAS, he was very active in civic and community
14 organizations, having membership and holding offices in various
15 facets of the community, including: Meridian Lions Club,
16 Mississippi Professional Arborist Association, Mississippi Urban
17 Forestry Association, South Central Community Forestry Council,
18 Meridian Tree Commission, Meridian Keep America Beautiful Council,
19 Utility Arborist Association, Boy Scouts of America - Risk
20 Management Committee for Choctaw Area Council, Board of Directors
21 for Dalewood Property Owners Association, in addition, an
22 affiliate of numerous fishing and hunting organizations and a
23 certified arborist; and
