A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF RAE

MILLER SUESS AND EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HER FAMILY AND 2 3 FRIENDS UPON HER PASSING. 4 WHEREAS, Rae Miller Suess, born January 25, 1925, to Randall and Grace Babcock Miller in San Antonio, Texas, departed this 5 earthly life on January 8, 2004, at the age of 78, causing great 6 sorrow and loss to her family and friends; and 7 8 WHEREAS, she graduated from high school in Lawton, Oklahoma, and attended Cameron Junior College and Oklahoma University where 9 she was a member of the Gamma Phi Beta Sorority; and 10 WHEREAS, upon the completion of her course of study, Mrs. 11 12 Suess became a food service supervisor for the field artillery men 13 and officers stationed at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and met her future husband, Captain James F. Suess, a training director in the field 14 15 artillery school; and WHEREAS, they were united in holy matrimony after World War 16 II on March 24, 1946, and moved to Chicago and later to Warren, 17 18 Pennsylvania; and WHEREAS, having developed her skills in tennis, golf and 19 20 duplicate bridge, the family moved to Jackson, Mississippi, in 21 1962, where she continued her pursuit of golf at the Colonial 22 Country Club where she was president of the "18 holers" and the "9 23 holers"; and WHEREAS, a fervently faithful and devoted member of St. 24 Phillips Episcopal Church, Mrs. Suess shared a deep passion for 25 26 travel and visited all seven continents by circumnavigating the world from West to East and East to West by air and sea; and 27
