## SENATE BILL NO. 2049

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-516, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE PENALTY IMPOSED FOR OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHIN 3 A HIGHWAY WORK ZONE IN EXCESS OF THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT SPECIFICALLY ESTABLISHED FOR THAT ZONE; TO REQUIRE THAT SIGNS BE POSTED IN HIGHWAY WORK ZONES INDICATING THAT THE FINE FOR SPEEDING IN SUCH WORK ZONES MAY BE PUNISHED BY A FINE OF DOUBLE THE MAXIMUM 7 AMOUNT OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED BY LAW; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROVISIONS 8 OF THIS SECTION MAY BE ENFORCED THROUGH THE USE OF AUTOMATED VEHICLE IDENTIFICATION SYSTEMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10

- 11 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-516, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 12
- 63-3-516. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to 13
- operate a motor vehicle within a highway work zone at a speed in 14
- excess of the maximum speed limit specifically established for the 15
- 16 zone whenever workers are present and whenever the zone is
- indicated by appropriately placed signs displaying the reduced 17
- 18 maximum speed limit. Any person violating the provisions of this
- 19 section shall be punished, upon conviction, by a fine of not more
- than double the maximum amount of the fine authorized to be 20
- 21 imposed under Section 63-9-11.
- (a) For purposes of enforcing the provisions of this 22
- 23 section, the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol may operate radar
- 24 speed detection devices in conjunction with automated vehicle
- 25 identification systems in highway work zones. If a violation of
- this section is detected through the use of an automated vehicle 26
- identification system, a photograph of the vehicle taken by the 27
- automated vehicle identification system and a uniform traffic 28
- 29 ticket setting forth the details of the violation shall be served
- 30 upon the owner of the vehicle.

31	(b) An automated vehicle identification system shall
32	not be used unless signs are posted in conspicuous places not less
33	than three hundred (300) feet before the entry into the highway
34	work zone. The Mississippi Department of Transportation shall be
35	responsible for the placement of such signs.
36	(c) A traffic ticket shall not be issued for a
37	violation of this section that is detected through the use of an
38	automated vehicle identification system unless a patrolman of the
39	Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol is present during the operation
40	of the automated vehicle identification system at the time the
41	violation is alleged to have occurred.
42	(d) Violations detected by means of an automated
43	vehicle identification system shall not be recorded on the
44	violator's driving record.
45	(3) For the purposes of this section:
46	(a) "Highway work zone" means a construction or
47	maintenance area that is located on or along any public highway,
48	<u>road or street within this state</u> that is marked:
49	(i) By appropriate warning signs or other traffic
50	control devices indicating that work is in progress; and
51	(ii) By signs of a design approved by the
52	Department of Transportation indicating that any person who
53	operates a motor vehicle within a highway work zone at a speed in
54	excess of the reduced maximum speed limit may be punished by a
55	fine of double the maximum amount otherwise authorized by law.
56	(b) "Automated vehicle identification system" means a
57	system whereby a device is used to automatically detect a
58	violation of a traffic law and simultaneously record a photograph
59	of the vehicle, the operator of the vehicle and the license plate
60	of the vehicle.
61	$\underline{(4)}$ Nothing in this section shall preclude the prosecution
62	or conviction for reckless driving of any motor vehicle operator

whose operation of a motor vehicle in a highway work zone, apart

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- 64 from speed, demonstrates a reckless disregard for life, limb or
- 65 property.
- 66 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 67 and after July 1, 2004.
