SENATE BILL NO. 2137

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-3-42, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 ALLOW THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO GRADE PRIVATE PARKING 2 3 PADS WHEN USED BY SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS TO PARK BUSES AT THEIR HOME; 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 19-3-42, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 19-3-42. (1) The board of supervisors of any county is 8 9 hereby authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to: (a) Grade, gravel or shell, repair, and/or maintain 10 private gravel or shell roads or driveways to private residences 11 12 if such roads or driveways are used for school bus turnarounds; and 13 (b) Grade, gravel or shell, repair, and/or maintain 14 private parking pads, if such parking pads are used by school bus 15 16 drivers to park buses at their homes. (2) Prior to engaging in the work authorized in subsection 17 (1) of this section, the board of supervisors shall spread upon 18 the official minutes of the board: 19 20 (a) The written request of the school board for such 21 work; The written approval of the board of supervisors 22 (b) 23 for such work; 24 (C) The specific location of the road, driveway or 25 parking pad to be worked; and 26 (d) The name of the owner of the road, driveway or 27 parking pad to be worked.

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The written request of the school board, as required in 28 (3) 29 subsection (2)(a) above, shall contain a current list of all active school bus turnarounds or parking pads presently in use by 30 31 the school district or contemplated for use by the school district 32 for the present school year. The approval by the board of 33 supervisors shall be valid and effective for the period of time 34 that a turnaround is anticipated for use, but in no event for a period greater than one (1) year. 35

In addition to the authority granted in subsection (1) 36 (4) of this section, from and after October 1, 1989, the board of 37 38 supervisors of any county is further authorized, in its discretion, to maintain public school grounds of the county and to 39 40 grade, gravel, shell or overlay, and/or to maintain gravel, shell, asphalt or concrete roads, driveways or parking lots of public 41 schools of the county if, before engaging in such work, the board 42 of supervisors shall spread upon its official minutes the written 43 44 request of the school board for such work, the written approval of 45 the board of supervisors for such work and the specific location of the school grounds or road, driveway or parking lot, to be 46 47 worked.

In addition to any other authority granted in this 48 (5) 49 section, the board of supervisors of any county is hereby 50 authorized, in its discretion, to repair and maintain driveways 51 and parking lots of: (a) any nonprofit organization in the county 52 which is tax exempt under Section 501(c) of the United States Internal Revenue Code and which has as one of its primary purposes 53 54 for organization to aid and assist in the rehabilitation of persons suffering from drug abuse or drug addiction; and (b) any 55 56 private, nonprofit cemeteries in the county. The board of 57 supervisors of any county shall not be authorized under the 58 provisions of this subsection to repair or maintain driveways or 59 parking lots located more than one hundred fifty (150) feet from

62 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 63 and after July 1, 2004.
