SENATE BILL NO. 2163

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 47-5-935, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT A WARDEN APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF 2 3 SUPERVISORS SHALL BE THE CHIEF CORRECTIONS OFFICER IN ANY COUNTY 4 WITH A REGIONAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITY HOUSING STATE INMATES; TO AMEND SECTION 47-5-937, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT 5 б REGIONAL FACILITIES' CONTRACTS FOR LEGAL SERVICES MAY NOT EXCEED 7 THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS SITTING AT THE TIME THE CONTRACT IS ADOPTED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. Section 47-5-935, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11 amended as follows:

47-5-935. Concurrent with the execution of a contract for 12 housing of state offenders as authorized by Sections 47-5-931 13 14 through 47-5-941, a warden hired by the board of supervisors of a county where the facility is located is designated as the chief 15 corrections officer for the facility housing state offenders, and 16 in that capacity, shall assume responsibility for management of 17 18 the corrections facility and for the provision of the care and control of the state offenders housed therein. The warden shall 19 be subject to the direction of the department for management of 20 the correctional facility. * * * 21

SECTION 2. Section 47-5-937, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

47-5-937. Sections 47-5-931 through 47-5-941 shall be full 24 25 and complete authority for the exercise of all powers and authority granted herein and no requirements or restrictions of 26 law which would otherwise be applicable to acts of the 27 28 county * * * or the Department of Corrections shall be applicable except as expressly provided herein. 31 a salary within the range allowed for a legal assistant to a 32 district attorney with the employment to continue for a period of 33 time not to exceed the <u>term of the board of supervisors sitting at</u> 34 <u>the time the contract is approved</u>. The county or counties shall 35 pay this cost and other costs incurred in the operation of the 36 facility from the proceeds of the funds derived from the financing 37 of the project and the housing of offenders.

38 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 39 and after October 1, 2004.
