SENATE BILL NO. 2173

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE REQUIREMENT THAT AN APPLICANT FOR A DRIVER'S 3 LICENSE PRESENT HIS SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 4 PUBLIC SAFETY SHALL NOT BE APPLICABLE TO A PERSON WHO FILES AN AFFIDAVIT WITH THE DEPARTMENT AFFIRMING THAT HE HAS NEVER BEEN 6 ISSUED A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER; TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-19, 7 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PRESCRIBE THE TYPES OF DOCUMENTS THAT AN APPLICANT FOR A MISSISSIPPI DRIVER'S LICENSE MAY PROVIDE TO THE DRIVER'S LICENSE EXAMINER IN ORDER TO SHOW PROOF OF RESIDENCE; AND 8 9 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. Section 63-1-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows: 63-1-35. (1) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall 14 prescribe the form of licenses issued pursuant to this article 15 which shall, among other features, include a driver's license 16 number assigned by the Department of Public Safety which, at the 17 option of the licensee, may or may not be the social security 18 19 number of the licensee. A licensee who chooses not to use his 20 social security number as his driver's license number, except as otherwise provided under subsection (2) of this section, shall 21 list his social security number with the department which shall 22 cross reference the social security number with the driver's 23 24 license number for purposes of identification. Additionally, each license shall bear a full face color photograph of the licensee in 25 26 such form that the license and the photograph cannot be separated. 27 Such photograph shall be taken so that one (1) exposure will photograph the applicant and the application simultaneously on the 28 29 same film. The department shall use a process in the issuance of

a license with a color photograph which shall prevent as nearly as

possible any alteration, counterfeiting, duplication,

- 32 reproduction, forging or modification of such license or the
- 33 superimposition of a photograph without ready detection. Such
- 34 photograph shall be replaced by the department at the time of
- 35 renewal. Driver licenses, including photographs appearing
- 36 thereon, may be renewed by electronic means according to rules and
- 37 regulations promulgated by the commissioner. The Department of
- 38 Public Safety may accept bank credit cards and debit cards in
- 39 payment of fees for driver license renewals that are processed by
- 40 electronic means and, if authorized by general law, may charge an
- 41 additional fee for the use of such cards.
- 42 (2) An applicant who does not have, or who states that he
- 43 has never been issued, a social security number as required under
- 44 subsection (1) of this section, shall complete an affidavit, under
- 45 penalty of perjury, affirming that he has never been issued a
- 46 <u>social security</u> number.
- 47 (3) The commissioner shall prescribe the form of licenses
- 48 issued pursuant to this article to licensees who are not United
- 49 States citizens and who do not possess a social security number
- 50 issued by the United States government. The licenses of such
- 51 persons shall include a number and any other identifying features
- 52 the commissioner prescribes.
- 53 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 54 amended as follows:
- 55 63-1-19. (1) * * * Every applicant for a license or permit
- 56 issued pursuant to this article, or for renewal of such license or
- 57 permit, shall file an application for such license, permit or
- 58 renewal, on a form provided by the Department of Public Safety,
- 59 with the commissioner or an official license examiner of the
- 60 department. All persons not holding valid, unexpired licenses
- 61 issued in this state shall be required to secure an original
- 62 license, except those specifically exempted from licensing under
- 63 Section 63-1-7. The application shall state the name, date of
- 64 birth, the social security number of the applicant unless the

- 65 applicant is not a United States citizen and does not possess a
- 66 social security number issued by the United States government,
- 67 sex, race, color of eyes, color of hair, weight, height and
- 68 residence address, and whether or not the applicant's privilege to
- 69 drive has been suspended or revoked at any time, and, if so, when,
- 70 by whom, and for what cause, and whether any previous application
- 71 by him has been denied, and whether he has any physical defects
- 72 which would interfere with his operating a motor vehicle safely
- 73 upon the highways.
- 74 (2) Every applicant for an original license shall show proof
- 75 of residence in this state. Proof of residence shall not be
- 76 required of applicants under eighteen (18) years of age. * * * An
- 77 applicant for an original license, who is eighteen (18) years of
- 78 age or older, may show proof of residence in this state by
- 79 presenting to the license examiner at least two (2) of the
- 80 following documents:
- 81 (a) A utility bill, including telephone service,
- 82 showing a valid residential address;
- 83 (b) A bank statement showing a valid Mississippi
- 84 address;
- 85 (c) An acceptable employer verification, such as an
- 86 employment identification card, a letter from the employer on its
- 87 official letterhead or a payroll check or payroll check stub;
- 88 (d) An automobile, life or health insurance policy
- 89 showing a valid Mississippi address;
- 90 (e) A driver's license issued by the State of
- 91 Mississippi to a parent, legal guardian or spouse;
- 92 (f) A Mississippi motor vehicle registration showing a
- 93 valid Mississippi address;
- 94 (g) An Internal Revenue Service Tax Reporting W-2 Form;
- 95 (h) A receipt for personal or real estate taxes paid
- 96 within the last year showing a valid Mississippi address;

97	(i) A copy of a residential lease showing a valid
98	Mississippi address; or
99	(j) If the applicant is a student enrolled in a public
L00	or private school in Mississippi, a photo student identification
L01	and acceptable documentation that the student resides on campus.
L02	(3) If an applicant is unable to provide at least two (2) of
L03	the documents described in subsection (2) of this section, he may
L04	provide one of the documents described in subsection (2) of this
L05	section and one (1) of the following documents:
L06	(a) The Individual Taxpayer Identification Number
L07	(ITIN) issued by the Internal Revenue Service;
L08	(b) Form I-94 issued to the applicant by the United
L09	States Immigration and Naturalization Service;
L10	(c) An Employment Authorization Card (EAC) issued to
L11	the applicant by the United States Immigration and Naturalization
L12	Service;
L13	(d) A Permanent Residence Card issued to the applicant
L14	by the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service; or
L15	(e) A stamp in a foreign passport issued by the United
L16	States Immigration and Naturalization Service showing evidence of
L17	lawful admission for permanent residence.
L18	(4) The documents described in subsections (1) and (2) of
L19	this section must include the applicant's name or the name of the
L20	applicant's spouse, if the applicant has a spouse, or if the
L21	applicant is a minor, the name of a parent or legal guardian.
L22	These documents must also show the valid residence address of the
L23	applicant being used on the application for the Mississippi
L24	driver's license.
L25	(5) Unless the applicant is not a United States citizen and
L26	does not possess a social security number issued by the United
L27	States government, each application or filing made under this
L28	section shall include the social security number(s) of the

- applicant in accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 130 1972.
- 131 (6) No person who is illegally in the United States or
- 132 Mississippi shall be issued a license. The application of a
- 133 person who is not a United States citizen and who does not possess
- 134 a social security number issued by the United States government
- 135 shall state the name, date of birth, sex, race, color of eyes,
- 136 color of hair, weight, height and residence address, and whether
- 137 or not the applicant's privilege to drive has been suspended or
- 138 revoked at any time, and, if so, when, by whom, and for what
- 139 cause, and whether any previous application by him has been
- 140 denied, and whether he has any physical defects which would
- 141 interfere with his operating a motor vehicle safely upon the
- 142 highways. The commissioner shall adopt and promulgate such rules
- 143 and regulations as he deems appropriate requiring additional
- 144 documents, materials, information or physical evidence to be
- 145 provided by the applicant as may be necessary to establish the
- 146 identity of the applicant and that the applicant is not present in
- 147 the United States or the State of Mississippi illegally.
- 148 (7) (a) Any male who is at least eighteen (18) years of age
- 149 but less than twenty-six (26) years of age and who applies for a
- 150 permit or license or a renewal of a permit or license under this
- 151 chapter shall be registered in compliance with the requirements of
- 152 Section 3 of the Military Selective Service Act, 50 USCS Appx 451
- 153 et seq., as amended.
- 154 (b) The department shall forward in an electronic
- 155 format the necessary personal information of the applicant to the
- 156 Selective Service System. The applicant's submission of the
- 157 application shall serve as an indication that the applicant either
- 158 has already registered with the Selective Service System or that
- 159 he is authorizing the department to forward to the Selective
- 160 Service System the necessary information for registration. The
- 161 commissioner shall notify the applicant on, or as a part of, the

- 162 application that his submission of the application will serve as
- 163 his consent to registration with the Selective Service System, if
- 164 so required. The commissioner also shall notify any male
- 165 applicant under the age of eighteen (18) that he will be
- 166 registered upon turning age eighteen (18) as required by federal
- 167 law.
- 168 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 169 and after July 1, 2004.
