## SENATE BILL NO. 2192

AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE 1 SELECTION AND GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE OF LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS IN 2 MISSISSIPPI; TO PROVIDE FOR A REPORT TO THE 2005 REGULAR SESSION 3 OF THE LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** (1) There is hereby created a task force to 6 7 conduct a study of the selection and governance structure of local school boards in Mississippi. The purpose of such study is to 8 9 review current statutory provisions for the selection of school 10 board members and the forms of governance of school boards and to consider optional methods of selection, composition and authority 11 12 of school boards in Mississippi which may enhance and promote more efficient operations of school systems. The membership of the 13 task force shall include the following thirteen (13) members: 14 The Chairman of the Senate Education Committee, who 15 (a) 16 will serve as temporary chairman of the task force; 17 (b) One (1) member of the Senate appointed by the 18 Lieutenant Governor; 19 (C) The Chairman of the House of Representatives Education Committee; 20 21 (d) One (1) member of the House appointed by the Speaker of the House; 22 One (1) local school board member appointed by the 23 (e) 24 Mississippi School Boards Association, serving as an elected member of a local board of education; 25 26 (f) One (1) local school board member appointed by the Mississippi School Boards Association, serving as an appointed 27 member of a local board of education; 28 \*SS01/R109\* S. 29 One (1) representative of the business community (g) 30 appointed by the Mississippi Economic Council; 31 (h) One (1) representative from the Public Education 32 Forum; 33 (i) One (1) local elected superintendent of education 34 appointed by the Mississippi Association of School Superintendents; 35 (j) One (1) local appointed superintendent of education 36 appointed by the Mississippi Association of School 37 38 Superintendents; 39 (k) One (1) member of the general public appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; 40 41 (1) One (1) member of the general public appointed by 42 the Speaker of the House; and 43 The Executive Director of the Mississippi (m) 44 Development Authority. The task force shall make a report of its findings and 45 (2) 46 recommendations, including necessary legislation, to the Legislature, the Lieutenant Governor and the Governor for 47 48 implementation in the 2005 Regular Session. The task force may recommend continuation of its review until the 2006 Regular 49 50 Session if it is unable to complete its responsibilities. (3) The temporary chairman of the task force shall call a 51 meeting within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this bill 52 53 and the task force shall elect a chairman from its membership, in addition to such other officers as it may deem appropriate. A 54 55 majority of the members of the committee shall constitute a All members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, 56 quorum. 57 such notices to be mailed at least five (5) days prior to the date on which a meeting is to be held. 58 59 (4) Legislative members of the task force shall be paid from 60 the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same amounts as provided for committee meetings when the

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62 Legislature is not in session. Nonlegislative members of the task 63 force who are not state employees or local school district 64 employees shall be reimbursed for actual necessary expenses in 65 attending called meetings of the task force, to be paid from any 66 funds made available for such purpose by the Legislature.

67 (5) All agencies and divisions of agencies affected by this
68 study and review are hereby directed to cooperate with the task
69 force in formulating and preparing its recommendations.

70 (6) The task force is empowered to select a consultant or 71 consultants to conduct the study mandated under this section, 72 subject to specific appropriation therefor by the Legislature, and 73 following the applicable regulations of the Personal Service 74 Contract Review Board.

75 (7) The task force is empowered to utilize staff already 76 employed by the agencies and school districts affected by this 77 study and any other assistance made available to it.

78 (8) Upon presentation of its final report, the task force79 shall be dissolved.

80 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 81 and after its passage.
