AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-13-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 AUTHORIZE MUNICIPAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO ENFORCE, UNDER 2 3 CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES, THE PROVISIONS OF THE MISSISSIPPI MOTOR $% \left({{\left[{{{\left[{{C_{{\rm{T}}}} \right]}} \right]}} \right)$ VEHICLE SAFETY INSPECTION LAW THAT REQUIRE THE DISPLAY OF A VALID 4 MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTION CERTIFICATE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 63-13-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8

9 63-13-7. (1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, the Commissioner of Public Safety shall, not more than 10 once each year, require that every motor vehicle, trailer, 11 semitrailer and pole trailer registered in this state be inspected 12 and that an official certificate of inspection and approval be 13 14 obtained for each such vehicle. Each such vehicle must display at all times a certificate of inspection and approval duly issued for 15 16 such vehicle upon the lower left-hand corner of the windshield thereof or upon such vehicle in such position as to be visible 17 from the outside. 18

19 (2) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, 20 every motor vehicle registered in any other state and operated 21 over the highways of this state shall be inspected and shall 22 display an inspection certificate which shall be different either 23 in color or design from the inspection certificates issued for use 24 on state registered vehicles.

However, the Commissioner of Public Safety may authorize the acceptance in this state of a certificate of inspection and approval issued under the authority of a qualified agency or department of another state, provided that every municipality,

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29 county and state office in such other state accepts under a 30 mutually acceptable reciprocal agreement, Mississippi's 31 certificate of inspection and approval. The commissioner shall 32 except from the provisions of this chapter all passenger buses and 33 other vehicles certified by the United States Department of 34 Transportation and subject to its rules and regulations and its 35 periodical inspections.

(3) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall require all 36 school buses in the State of Mississippi to be inspected during 37 38 the months of July or August each year and may provide such 39 special certificate of inspection and approval as he may deem 40 necessary.

41 (4) A motor vehicle manufactured or having a model year earlier than 1961 shall not be required to be inspected or to 42 display a certificate of inspection under the provisions of this 43 chapter. 44

Members of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol and law 45 (5) 46 enforcement officers of incorporated municipalities within their respective jurisdictions may enforce the provisions of this 47 chapter requiring the display of a valid motor vehicle inspection 48 certificate; provided, however, that a municipal law enforcement 49 50 officer shall not stop a motor vehicle for a violation of this chapter, or charge an individual with a violation of this chapter, 51 unless the motor vehicle is stopped as a result of some other 52 offense. 53 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 54 and after its passage.

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
