## SENATE BILL NO. 2288

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE SHINING OF A LIGHT FROM A PUBLIC ROAD 1 ONTO THE ADJOINING LANDS OF ANOTHER DURING THE NIGHT; TO PROVIDE 2 3 EXCEPTIONS; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT; AND 4 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 **SECTION 1.** (1) It is unlawful for a person to shine a light 6 7 from a public road onto the adjoining lands of another during the night from one-half (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour 8 9 before sunrise. This section does not apply to the normal use of 10 headlights of a vehicle traveling on a public road, to law enforcement, emergency or utility personnel in the performance of 11 their duty, or to a lessee on lands leased by the lessee. 12 (2) Any person convicted of a violation of this section 13 shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars 14 (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by 15 imprisonment in the county jail for not less than sixty (60) days 16 nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and 17 18 imprisonment. 19 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

20 and after July 1, 2004.
