SENATE BILL NO. 2327

AN ACT TO CREATE A POULTRY GROWERS GRIEVANCE BOARD; TO 1 PROVIDE FOR GRIEVANCES TO BE HEARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 5 Mississippi Poultry Growers Grievance Act. 6 SECTION 2. As used in this act: 7 (a) "Board" means the Poultry Growers Grievance Review 8 Board created in this act. 9 (b) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Commerce. 10 11 "Department" means the Mississippi Department of (C) 12 Agriculture and Commerce. "Grower" means a person who grows, raises or (d) 13 produces poultry or poultry products and contracts with a 14 15 processor to provide management, labor, machinery, facilities or any other production input for the production of poultry or 16 17 poultry products. (e) "Person" means any individual, partnership, 18 association, corporation, limited liability company, or any other 19 20 legal entity. "Processor" means a person who in the ordinary 21 (f) 22 course of business, buys poultry or poultry products grown, raised 23 or produced in this state or who contracts with a grower to grow, raise or produce poultry or poultry products in this state. 24 25 SECTION 3. There is hereby created the Mississippi Poultry Growers Grievance Review Board and its office shall be located in 26 Jackson, Mississippi. The board shall be composed of six (6) 27 *SS02/R457* S. B. members: one (1) member shall be the Commissioner of Agriculture 28 and Commerce as ex officio member. One (1) member shall be 29 30 appointed from each congressional district and the remainder from 31 the state at large. The commissioner shall appoint the members to 32 terms of one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4) and five (5) years, 33 respectively, so as to stagger the terms. After the expiration of the initial terms, the terms shall be for four (4) years. 34 Each member shall serve, after the completion of his term, until his 35 successor is appointed and duly qualified. Each vacancy shall be 36 filled by appointment for the unexpired term. 37

38 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The powers and duties of the board shall 39 include, but be not limited to, the following:

40 (a) To hear grievances of growers and producers. The41 grievance procedure shall be voluntary.

42 (b) To schedule each session of the grievance process
43 in a timely manner and to hold the session in a location
44 convenient to the parties involved.

45 (2) All material, data and information received by the 46 board, with respect to any grievance filed under this act, are 47 confidential and not subject to the Public Records Act. No 48 official or employee of the board may knowingly disclose any such 49 information without the consent of the parties involved.

50 (3) The state shall bear the cost of the grievance process51 including the cost of all meetings.

52 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from 53 and after July 1, 2004.
