SENATE BILL NO. 2386 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-62, 1 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS 2 3 MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISH 4 THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND, THE SHILOH CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AND THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR MONUMENT TRUST 5 б FUND; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 55-15-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION WILL CONTINUE IN EXISTENCE UNTIL JULY 1, 2006, IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR THE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND DEDICATION OF FUTURE MONUMENTS TO 7 8 9 BE LOCATED AT SITES DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSION; TO AMEND SECTION 10 55-15-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF THE 11 REPEALER ON THE SECTION OF LAW THAT CREATES THE MISSISSIPPI 12 VETERANS MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISH THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND, THE SHILOH CONFEDERATE 13 14 MEMORIAL TRUST FUND AND THE CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR MONUMENT 15 TRUST FUND; TO CREATE A NEW SECTION TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD TO ESTABLISH, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A MISSISSIPPI VETERANS CEMETERY, WHICH SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE "MISSISSIPPI VETERANS MEMORIAL CEMETERY"; AND FOR RELATED 16 17 18 19 20 PURPOSES.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 22 SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 23 reenacted as follows:

24 55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in 25 the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 26 27 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument 28 29 should be established and maintained as a symbol of the recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 30 31 Mississippi veterans. SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 32 reenacted and amended as follows: 33 34 55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership 35

36 of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease
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37 serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of 38 Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi 39 Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 40 (7) members: 41 (a) The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 42 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; 43 44 The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans (b) Affairs Board; 45 The Director of the Division of General Services in 46 (C) 47 the Department of Finance and Administration; Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one 48 (d) 49 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as follows: 50 One (1) veteran of World War II; 51 (i) 52 (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; 53 54 One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, (e) appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. 55 56 The initial meeting of the commission shall be called (2)and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 57 58 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission shall 59 elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at the 60 call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings of 61 the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along with 62 63 all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of the 64 secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All actions 65 taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission shall be 66 67 by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea and nay 68 votes of each member present. The signature of the chairman and

The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans 71 (3) 72 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the 73 amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion 74 thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission 75 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while 76 on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other 77 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation 78 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as 79 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business. Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel 80 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more 81 82 than twelve (12) meetings per year.

83 (4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
84 to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
85 Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
86 Veterans Memorial Commission.

87 (5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
88 have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
89 pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

90 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall
91 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after
92 the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi
93 veterans monument until July 1, 2006, so that such commission can
94 provide for the design, construction and dedication of future
95 monuments to be located at sites designated by the Mississippi
96 Veterans Monument Commission.

97 SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 98 reenacted as follows:

99 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 100 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and 101 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans S. B. No. 2386 \*SSO1/R528PS\* 04/SS01/R528PS PAGE 3 102 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in 103 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.

104 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 105 reenacted as follows:

106 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission 107 shall:

(a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual
design and site of the monument shall be selected with the
approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

(b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit intothe Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

(c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.

SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 122 123 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 124 125 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 126 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited 127 128 into the fund. All appropriated funds and funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the 129 purpose of designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the 130 veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five 131 Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be expended annually to pay the 132 133 administrative costs of the commission. Costs associated with the designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans 134 \*SS01/R528PS\* S. B. No. 2386 04/SS01/R528PS

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135 monument are not considered commission administrative costs for 136 purposes of this section. Upon completion of the monument, money 137 in the trust fund shall be utilized by the Mississippi War 138 Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of the veterans 139 monument and memorials.

140 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 141 reenacted as follows:

55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 142 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 143 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission 144 145 shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 146 147 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and 148 dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 149 150 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of 151 Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 152 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 153 154 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 155 156 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 157 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature; 158 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty 159 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund 160 161 grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the 162 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument. 163 164 The board of supervisors of any county and the governing (2) 165 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and

166 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any

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169 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
170 reenacted as follows:

171 55-15-62. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 172 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is 173 174 hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument 175 recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of 176 177 In planning the design, construction and dedication of the Honor. monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the 178 179 State Veterans Affairs Board. The commission may solicit private 180 monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 181 182 Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. The 183 commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust 184 fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for 185 186 the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the 187 monument.

188 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 189 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 190 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 191 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the 192 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.

193 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 194 amended as follows:

195 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-62, Mississippi
196 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
197 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, 2006.
198 <u>SECTION 9.</u> (1) The State Veterans Affairs Board is
199 authorized to establish, operate and maintain a Mississippi

S. B. No. 2386 \*SS01/R528PS\* 04/SS01/R528PS PAGE 6 200 veterans cemetery in this state, which shall be known as the 201 "Mississippi Veterans Memorial Cemetery."

202 (2) The State Veterans Affairs Board has the primary 203 responsibility for verifying eligibility for interment in the veterans cemetery. Eligibility criteria for interment in the 204 205 cemetery is the same as required for interment in a national 206 cemetery as provided by federal law and rules and regulations 207 applicable thereto. However, to be eligible for interment a 208 veteran must have been a legal resident of the State of Mississippi for two (2) years immediately prior to his death. 209

(3) The cemetery shall be under the control andadministration of the State Veterans Affairs Board.

(4) Applications for interment in the cemetery shall be
processed in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by
the State Veterans Affairs Board.

215 (5) The State Veterans Affairs Board is designated as the 216 agency of this state to receive federal aid under Title 38 USC, as 217 amended, and is authorized to receive funds from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or any other agency of the United 218 219 States authorized to grant or expend funds to assist a state in 220 establishing, operating and maintaining a veterans cemetery. The 221 board is authorized to receive gifts, contributions, bequests and 222 individual reimbursements from any source, the receipt of which shall not exclude any other source of revenue. All funds received 223 224 by the board pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited into a special fund, hereby created and known as the "Mississippi 225 226 Veterans Cemetery Fund, " and shall be expended to establish, operate and maintain a veterans cemetery in this state. The State 227 228 Veterans Affairs Board is authorized to employ such personnel as 229 it may deem necessary to carry out its duties and responsibilities 230 under this section.

231 **SECTION 10.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 232 and after July 1, 2004.
