SENATE BILL NO. 2459

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-9-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE ANY STATE AGENCY TO DONATE SURPLUS GOODS AND SERVICES TO 3 THE LOCAL CHAPTERS OF THE AMERICAN RED CROSS; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 31-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 31-9-5. (1) The Office of General Services with the 9 approval of the Public Procurement Review Board shall negotiate 10 and contract with any appropriate agency or commission of the United States government or of the State of Mississippi for the 11 purpose of purchasing or otherwise securing surplus material or 12 property in bulk lots or quantities, and for the purpose of 13 assisting all agencies, departments, institutions and 14 instrumentalities of the State of Mississippi, the boards of 15 16 supervisors of the various counties, and the governing authorities of the various municipalities, drainage districts and other taxing 17 units in purchasing, leasing or otherwise securing surplus 18 19 material or property. After ascertaining the needs of the various state departments and institutions, counties, municipalities, 20 21 drainage districts and other taxing units, the Office of General Services may enter into contracts with the governing authorities 22 23 of such governmental entities as will enable them to carry out the provisions of this section. 24

25 (2) The Office of General Services also may acquire state or 26 federal government surplus property for nonprofit and tax exempt 27 health and educational institutions, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Camp 28 Fire Girls, military academies, volunteer fire departments, S. nonprofit cooperative water associations, Boys Clubs of America 29 30 and Girls Clubs of America; however, deliveries to these institutions shall be made only after they have established their 31 32 eligibility by meeting the requirements of the federal government, 33 have requested the Office of General Services to act for them in 34 acquiring government surplus property, and have agreed to comply with both the state and federal laws pertaining to acquisition and 35 utilization of the property. 36

37 (3) Any state agency is hereby authorized, in the discretion
 38 of its governing board or authority of its executive director, to
 39 donate surplus goods or services for the support of the local
 40 chapters of the American Red Cross.

41 (4) The Office of General Services may do all other things
42 which may be necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section.
43 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
44 and after July 1, 2004.
