COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2532

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-107-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO PROVIDE THAT THE CHILDREN AND SPOUSES OF DECEASED AUXILIARY, 3 PART-TIME OR RESERVE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WHOSE DEATH RESULTED 4 FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE LINE OF DUTY SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR STATE SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS; TO AMEND SECTION 45-2-1, MISSISSIPPI 5 б CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE HEIRS OF DECEASED AUXILIARY, 7 PART-TIME OR RESERVE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WHOSE DEATH RESULTED 8 FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE LINE OF DUTY SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR DEATH BENEFITS PAYABLE FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS DEATH 9 BENEFITS TRUST FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-107-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

14 37-107-3. (1) For the purposes of this chapter, Mississippi15 law enforcement officers shall be defined as follows:

16 (a) "State highway patrolmen" means all law enforcement
17 officers, regardless of department or bureau, of the Mississippi
18 Highway Safety Patrol.

19 (b) "Municipal police officers" means all law 20 enforcement officers of any municipality who are regular duty personnel on full-time status, * * * auxiliary or reserve 21 officers, or those serving on a temporary or part-time status. 22 (c) "Sheriffs" and "deputy sheriffs" means all law 23 24 enforcement officers of full-time duty status on a regular basis serving the sheriff's department of any county, * * * deputy 25 26 sheriffs who are engaged in administrative or civil duty, auxiliary or reserve deputies, or deputy sheriffs serving in a 27 28 temporary capacity or part-time basis. 29 (d) "Constables" means all duly elected constables of

30 any beat of any county within the state while actually engaged in

31 the performance of their duties concerning the criminal laws of 32 the county and state.

33 (e) "Conservation officers" means all duly appointed 34 game wardens employed by the State of Mississippi on a full-time 35 duty status while actually engaged in the performance of their 36 duties concerning the game laws of the state.

37 (f) "Alcoholic Beverage Control Division agents and 38 inspectors" means all duly appointed agents and investigators of 39 the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division of the Mississippi State 40 Tax Commission on a full-time duty status while actually engaged 41 in the performance of their duties concerning the alcoholic 42 beverage control laws of the state.

(g) Members of the National Guard serving as peace
officers when ordered to state emergency duty under authority
vested in the Governor by the Constitution and laws of the state.

46 (h) "Tax commission scales enforcement officers" means
47 all duly appointed scales enforcement officers of the Mississippi
48 State Tax Commission on a full-time duty status while actually
49 engaged in the performance of their duties.

50 (i) Duly appointed agents of the Mississippi Bureau of51 Narcotics.

52 (j) Correctional, Probation and Parole officers53 employed by the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

For the purposes of this chapter, Mississippi full-time 54 (2) 55 fire fighters shall be defined as all fire fighters employed by any subdivision of the State of Mississippi on a full-time duty 56 57 status while actually engaged in the performance of their duties, and volunteer fire fighters shall be defined as any volunteer fire 58 fighter registered with the State of Mississippi or a political 59 subdivision thereof on a volunteer fire fighting status while 60 61 actually engaged in the performance of fire fighting duties. 62 (3) For the purposes of this chapter, "child" or "children" means natural children, adopted children or stepchildren. 63

65 who was, at the time of the death of the decedent, legally married
66 to a Mississippi law enforcement officer, full-time fire fighter,
67 or volunteer fire fighter, or in the case of a law enforcement
68 officer, full-time fire fighter or volunteer fire fighter who
69 suffered fatal injuries or wounds, prior to or after March 13,
70 1990, who has not remarried.

71 SECTION 2. Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 72 amended as follows:

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45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:

(a) "Covered individual" means a law enforcement
officer or fire fighter as defined in this section when employed
by an employer as defined in this section; it does not include
employees of independent contractors. "Covered individual" also
includes volunteer fire fighters.

(b) "Employer" means a state board, commission, department, division, bureau, or agency, or a county, municipality or other political subdivision of the state, which employs, appoints or otherwise engages the services of covered individuals.

83 (c) "Fire fighter" means an individual who is trained 84 for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from 85 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to fire-fighting 86 activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform 87 emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials 88 or other emergency incident.

"Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn 89 (d)90 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of the state whose duties require the officer or employee to 91 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain 92 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing, 93 or convicted of a crime, whether the officer is on regular duty on 94 95 full-time status, an auxiliary or reserve officer, or is serving 96 on a temporary or part-time status.

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(2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a 97 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Forty 98 Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) when a law enforcement officer, 99 100 while engaged in the performance of the person's official duties, 101 is accidentally or intentionally killed or receives accidental or 102 intentional bodily injury that results in the loss of the covered 103 individual's life, provided that the killing is not the result of 104 suicide and that the bodily injury is not intentionally self-inflicted. 105

(b) The Department of Public Safety shall make a 106 107 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Forty 108 Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) when a fire fighter, while engaged 109 in the performance of the person's official duties, is accidentally or intentionally killed or receives accidental or 110 intentional bodily injury that results in loss of the covered 111 individual's life, provided that the killing is not the result of 112 suicide and that the bodily injury is not intentionally 113 114 self-inflicted.

(c) The payment provided for in this subsection shall 115 116 be made to the beneficiary who was designated in writing by the covered individual, signed by the covered individual and delivered 117 118 to the employer during the covered individual's lifetime. If no such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the 119 surviving child or children and spouse in equal portions, and if 120 121 there is no surviving child or spouse, then to the parent or parents. If a beneficiary is not designated and there is no 122 123 surviving child, spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made to the covered individual's estate. 124

(d) The payment made in this subsection is in addition to any workers' compensation or pension benefits and is exempt from the claims and demands of creditors of the covered individual.

special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers and Fire
Fighters Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
(\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
any other source.

(b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121, and those investments shall be subject to the limitations prescribed by Section 25-11-121.

(c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund.

(4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death benefits authorized under this section. The Department of Public Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement and standardize the payment of death benefits under this section, to administer the trust fund created by this section and to carry out the purposes of this section.
