 of cash or in-kind contributions or any combination of cash or
 in-kind contributions. In-kind contributions shall include, but
 not be limited to, the value of exhibits that are contributed to
 the children's museum authorized under Sections 16 through 33 of
- the children's museum authorized under Sections 16 through 33 of this act.

 (2) Upon the adoption of a resolution by the Department of
- Finance and Administration, declaring the necessity for the 169 170 issuance of any part or all of the general obligation bonds authorized by this section, the department shall deliver a 171 172 certified copy of its resolution or resolutions to the State Bond Commission. Upon receipt of such resolution, the State Bond 173 174 Commission, in its discretion, may act as the issuing agent, prescribe the form of the bonds, advertise for and accept bids, 175 176 issue and sell the bonds so authorized to be sold, and do any and all other things necessary and advisable in connection with the 177 issuance and sale of such bonds. The amount of bonds issued under 178 179 Sections 16 through 33 of this act shall not exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00). 180
- 181 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 182 and after its passage.
