Each of the following individuals shall file a 8 9 statement of economic interest with the commission in accordance 10 with the provisions of this chapter: (a) Persons elected by popular vote, excluding United 11 12 States Senators and United States Representatives, to any office, whether it be legislative, executive or judicial, and whether it 13 be statewide, district, county, municipal or any other political 14 subdivision, with the exception of members of boards of levee 15 16 commissioners and election commissioners; 17 (b) Members of local school boards that administer public funds, regardless of whether such members are elected or 18 19 appointed; Persons who are candidates for public office or who 20 (C) 21 are appointed to fill a vacancy in an office who, if elected, would be required to file under paragraph (a) of this section; 22 23 (d) Executive directors or heads of state agencies, by whatever name they are designated, who are paid in part or in 24 whole, directly or indirectly, from funds appropriated or 25 26 authorized to be expended by the Legislature, and the presidents 27 and trustees of all state-supported colleges, universities and 28 junior colleges; *SS01/R828* S. Members of any state board, commission or agency, 29 (e) including the Mississippi Ethics Commission, charged with the 30 administration or expenditure of public funds, with the exception 31 32 of advisory boards or commissions; provided, however, in order to 33 fulfill the legislative purposes of this chapter, the commission 34 may require, upon a majority vote, the filing of a statement of economic interest by members of an advisory board or commission; 35 36 and
