## SENATE BILL NO. 2724

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-35-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR A RESIDENT LICENSE AS A REAL ESTATE 3 BROKER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 73-35-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 73-35-7. Licenses shall be granted only to persons who 8 present, and to corporations, partnerships, companies or associations whose officers, associates or partners present 9 satisfactory proof to the commission that they are trustworthy and 10 competent to transact the business of a real estate broker or real 11 12 estate salesperson in such manner as to safeguard the interests of 13 the public. Every person who applies for a resident license as a real estate broker: (a) shall be age twenty-one (21) years or 14 15 over, and have his legal domicile in the State of Mississippi at the time he applies; (b) shall be subject to the jurisdiction of 16 this state, subject to the income tax laws and other excise laws 17 18 thereof, subject to the road and bridge privilege tax laws thereof; (c) shall not be an elector in any other state; (d) shall 19 20 have held a license as an active real estate salesperson for 21 twelve (12) months immediately prior to making application for the 22 broker's examination hereafter specified; (e) shall have successfully completed a minimum of one hundred twenty (120) hours 23 of courses in real estate as hereafter specified; and (f) shall 24 have successfully completed the real estate broker's examination 25 26 as hereafter specified.

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An applicant who has not held an active real estate 27 28 salesperson's license for a period of at least twelve (12) months 29 immediately prior to submitting an application shall have 30 previously held a resident license as a real estate broker or 31 successfully completed a minimum of one hundred fifty (150) 32 classroom hours in real estate courses, which courses are 33 acceptable for credit toward a degree at a college or university as approved by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. 34

Every applicant for a resident license as a real estate salesperson shall be age eighteen (18) years or over, shall be a bona fide resident of the State of Mississippi prior to filing his application, and shall have successfully completed a minimum of sixty (60) hours in courses in real estate as hereafter specified; and shall have successfully completed the real estate salesperson's examination as hereafter specified.

The residency requirements set forth in this section shall not apply to those licensees of other states who qualify and obtain nonresident licenses in this state.

The commission is authorized to exempt from such prelicensing 45 46 educational requirements, in whole or in part, a real estate licensee of another state who desires to obtain a license under 47 48 this chapter; provided, however, that the prelicensing educational requirements in the other state are determined by the commission 49 50 to be equivalent to prelicensing educational requirements in this state and provided that such state extends this same privilege or 51 exemption to Mississippi real estate licensees. 52

53 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 54 and after its passage.

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
