COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2806

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-153, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE REQUIREMENTS FOR NATIVE SON OR DAUGHTER NONRESIDENT 3 LIFETIME SPORTSMAN HUNTING LICENSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 49-7-153, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 49-7-153. (1) Any resident may purchase a lifetime 8 sportsman hunting and fishing license by filing an application in the office of the department. The license shall qualify the 9 licensee to take all fish, game and fowl, except waterfowl, 10 including deer and turkey, in the manner provided by law. The 11 12 license shall also permit the licensee to hunt with primitive 13 weapons and bow and arrow, and to fish in the public waters of the state, including the taking of crabs, oysters, shrimp and any 14 15 saltwater fish authorized to be taken under a recreational 16 license.

The department may issue a resident lifetime sportsman 17 (2) 18 license at a fee to be determined by the commission at an amount not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a person 19 20 thirteen (13) years of age or older and not less than Five Hundred 21 Dollars (\$500.00) for a person under thirteen (13) years of age. 22 All lifetime licenses shall be issued from the office of the department. Each application for a lifetime license must be 23 accompanied by a certified copy of the birth certificate of the 24 individual to be named as the license holder, if the individual is 25 26 twelve (12) years of age or under.

The commission shall establish proof of residency 27 (3) 28 requirements for the purchase of a lifetime license, and shall 29 also establish such restrictions on and regulations for lifetime 30 licenses as it deems necessary and proper. An applicant for a 31 resident lifetime license must have been domiciled in this state 32 for eighteen (18) consecutive months immediately preceding the 33 date of his application for a license. The burden of proving 34 domicile shall be on the applicant.

The department may issue a native son or daughter 35 (4)(a) 36 nonresident lifetime sportsman hunting and fishing license. The 37 commission shall establish the fee, but the fee shall not be less than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). The applicant 38 39 must provide a certified copy of the original birth certificate 40 showing that the applicant was born in Mississippi and/or if the parents' address was in Mississippi at the time of birth as shown 41 on the birth certificate or other documents and/or official 42 43 documents reflect that one of said parents was on active military 44 service outside the State of Mississippi at the time of said Further, if the birth certificate of one parent reflects 45 birth. 46 that the parent was born in the State of Mississippi, and if 47 either parent is a resident of the State of Mississippi, then the applicant may be issued a native son or daughter nonresident 48 lifetime sportsman license * * *. 49

50 (5) Any materially false statement contained in an 51 application for a lifetime license renders void the license issued 52 pursuant to that application, and subjects the applicant to 53 criminal prosecution under Section 49-7-45.

54 (6) Nothing in this section exempts an applicant for a
55 lifetime license from meeting other qualifications or requirements
56 otherwise established by law for the privilege of hunting or
57 fishing.

58 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 59 and after July 1, 2004.
