- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 75-67-309, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 75-67-309. (1) The pledgor or seller shall sign a statement
- 8 verifying that the pledgor or seller is the rightful owner of the
- goods or is entitled to sell or pledge the goods and shall receive 9
- an exact copy of the pawn ticket which shall be signed or 10
- initialed by the pawnbroker or any employee of the pawnbroker. 11
- The pawnbroker shall maintain a record of all 12
- 13 transactions of pledged or purchased goods on the premises.
- pawnbroker shall upon request provide to the appropriate law 14
- 15 enforcement agency a complete record of all transactions. These
- records shall be a correct copy of the entries made of the pawn or 16
- purchase transaction, except as to the amount of cash advanced or 17
- 18 paid for the goods and monthly pawnshop charge. If the law
- 19 enforcement agency supplies the appropriate computer software and
- 20 the pawnbroker has the appropriate computer hardware, all
- 21 transactions shall be made available by means of electronic
- 22 transmission through a modem or similar device or by providing a
- computer disc to the law enforcement agency within seventy-two 23
- (72) hours of the transaction. Any pawnbroker who is recording 24
- transactions through the use of computer hardware on the effective 25
- 26 date of this act and is provided such appropriate software shall

- 27 not cease or alter the use of his computer hardware unless
- 28 authorized by the law enforcement agency.
- 29 (3) All goods purchased across the counter by the pawnbroker
- 30 shall be maintained on the premises by the pawnbroker for at least
- 31 fourteen (14) calendar days if the pawnbroker makes available all
- 32 transactions either electronically or on computer disc to the
- 33 appropriate law enforcement agency as provided in subsection (2)
- 34 above. Otherwise, the pawnbroker shall maintain on the premises
- 35 the purchased goods for twenty-one (21) calendar days.
- 36 (4) The pawnbroker shall maintain a record of all
- 37 transactions of goods sold on the premises. A pawnbroker shall
- 38 upon request provide to the appropriate law enforcement agency a
- 39 complete record of all such transactions.
- 40 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 41 and after July 1, 2004.
