## SENATE BILL NO. 2818

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO AUTHORIZE A DISABLED PERSON TO OBTAIN SPECIAL DISABLED PERSON 3 LICENSE TAGS FOR NOT MORE THAN TWO VEHICLES REGISTERED IN HIS 4 NAME; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the 9 State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 10 ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 11 the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation 12 International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on 13 Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than two (2) vehicles 14 that are registered in the applicant's name. The initial 15 16 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 17 licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 18 19 walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant will have the disability for at least five (5) years. The State 20 21 Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of the various counties, decals for placement on the special license 22 23 plates. The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the license plate was issued and the year in which the special license 24 plate will expire. The special license plate issued under this 25 26 section is valid for the period of time that the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 27 28 27-19-31(1). 30 submitting to the county tax collector, on or before its 31 expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the 32 physician has determined (a) that the applicant meets the 33 definition of a person with a disability which limits or impairs 34 the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have the disability for at least five (5) years. If an applicant fails to 35 renew the special license plate before its date of expiration, 36 then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county 37 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a 38 39 regular license plate to replace the special license plate. The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this 40 41 section, includes motorcycles. The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 42 ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons 43 who, as determined by a licensed physician: 44 45 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping 46 to rest; or Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, 47 (b) 48 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, 49 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or 50 (c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one 51 52 (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1) 53 liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60) 54 mm/hg on room air at rest; or 55 (d) Use portable oxygen; or Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the 56 (e) person's functional limitations are classified in severity as 57 Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American 58 59 Heart Association; or 60 (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due 61 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition. \*SS02/R1203\* S. 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An applicant for a special license plate bearing the International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

68 (2) The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and 69 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with 70 disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. 71 The 72 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. 73 The initial 74 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 75 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of 76 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 77 These placards shall be valid for the period of time that walk. 78 the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant 79 to Section 27-19-31(1) and may be renewed in the same manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates under 80 81 subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard or by 82 83 hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle. The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles. 84

85 (3) The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application 86 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability 87 88 to walk. Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and 89 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 90 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a 91 92 temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the 93 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 94 \*SS02/R1203\* S. The certification shall also include the period 95 ability to walk. 96 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the 97 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 98 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the 99 vehicle dashboard or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the 100 vehicle. The temporary removable windshield placard shall be valid for a period of time for which the physician has determined 101 102 that the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six (6) 103 months from the date of issuance. The State Tax Commission shall 104 prescribe the placement for motorcycles.

105 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary 106 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:

(a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be white on a red shield);

(b) An identification number and, on the reverse side,the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;

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(c) A date of expiration; and

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(d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.

116 (5) (a) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle 117 does not (i) have displayed the removable windshield placard 118 119 authorized in this section, (ii) have the special license plate issued under this section properly displayed upon the motor 120 121 vehicle, or (iii) have the disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 27-19-53 properly displayed upon the motor 122 vehicle. Any person who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such 123 124 areas, or who blocks such spaces or access thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 125 126 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each such 127 For the third and subsequent offenses under this violation. \*SS02/R1203\* S. 128 section, the offender's driver's license shall be suspended for 129 ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public Safety in 130 accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine imposed. 131 The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required to be 132 imposed under this subsection.

133 A person who is charged with a violation of this (b) section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for 134 persons who are disabled and failing properly to display (i) a 135 136 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle, (ii) a special 137 138 license plate issued under this section upon the vehicle or (iii) a disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 139 140 27-19-53 upon the vehicle shall not be convicted and shall have 141 the charge dismissed upon presentation to the court of proof by means of sworn oral testimony or sworn affidavit that at the time 142 143 of the charged violation he or a passenger in the vehicle 144 possessed a valid removable windshield placard issued under this 145 section.

146 (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special 147 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with 148 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the 149 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained, 150 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be 151 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

152 (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces 153 154 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce 155 such designated parking on private property. Any owner of private 156 157 property may tow away a vehicle that is parked on the owner's 158 private property in violation of the disabled parking restrictions 159 set forth in this section at the vehicle owner's expense. 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161 penalties provided in this section. Only areas marked in 162 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility 163 Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces 164 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.

165 (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 166 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 167 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 168 169 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges 170 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, 171 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle. 172

(9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk. The identification required to park in such an area, except as provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:

(a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a
permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard
must be displayed or the vehicle must have a special license tag
issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed.

(b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk, or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary windshield placard must be displayed.

Any person who parks in an area set aside for persons who are disabled in violation of this subsection shall be punished as provided for in subsection (5) of this section.

(10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or other institution that transports disabled persons, the State Tax Commission may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is

198 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 199 and after July 1, 2004.
