SENATE BILL NO. 2849

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION OF REED ACT FUNDS TO  
2 SECONDARY AND POST-SECONDARY VOCATIONAL CENTERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
3 MEASURING AND BUILDING BASIC WORKPLACE SKILLS IN STUDENTS ENROLLED  
4 IN VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL PROGRAMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** (1) Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, a  
7 portion of Mississippi's Reed Act Funds, Two Million Five Hundred  
8 Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000.00), shall be allocated for that  
9 school year to the Mississippi Department of Education's Office of  
10 Vocational/Technical Education to purchase a workforce development  
11 system that measures specific workplace skills and comprehensive  
12 software that will target instruction for building students'  
13 skills with the following restrictions:

14 (a) The workforce development system will allow  
15 communication on a common scale among individuals (students, job  
16 applicants, current employees), employers, educators and trainers.

17 (b) The assessment will measure students' workplace  
18 skills as they enter vocational/technical programs and again as  
19 they complete these programs. This assessment package will  
20 include at a minimum these basic components: reading for  
21 information, applied mathematics and locating information.

22 (c) The assessment will identify workplace skills  
23 required for specific jobs and will assist teachers and trainers  
24 with targeted instruction where skill gaps occur. Students will  
25 be able to build skill areas needing improvement during the  
26 two-year vocational/technical programs as they prepare for  
27 Mississippi's job opportunities.

28           (d) The comprehensive targeted instructional software  
29 program will be designed for the building of workplace skills and  
30 maintain the common scale and language of the assessment package.

31           (e) The comprehensive instructional software program  
32 shall include skill ranges to assist students whose skill  
33 achievement levels are very low. The software shall assist  
34 special populations' students such as: individuals with  
35 disabilities, economically disadvantaged, single parents,  
36 displaced homemakers, those preparing for nontraditional training  
37 and employment and students with other barriers to educational  
38 achievement such as limited English proficiency.

39           **SECTION 2.** Beginning with the school year 2005-2006, a  
40 portion of Reed Act Funds, One Million Five Hundred Thousand  
41 Dollars (\$1,500,000.00), shall be allocated each year for the next  
42 five (5) years to continue providing a uniform process for  
43 measuring students' skill levels within vocational programs and to  
44 update the software designed to build skills each year with these  
45 expected outcomes:

46           (a) Students can improve workplace skills as well as  
47 improve state test scores and college entrance test scores during  
48 the two-year program.

49           (b) Teacher techniques and strategies can improve with  
50 each year of targeted administration and instruction resulting in  
51 better student performance.

52           **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
53 and after July 1, 2004.
