## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2893

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO OPEN
THE REGULAR OPEN SEASON ON TURKEY ON THE MONDAY IMMEDIATELY
FOLLOWING SPECIAL YOUTH WEEKEND HUNT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. Section 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 8 49-7-31. (1) The open season for game birds and game
- 9 animals shall be as follows:

- 10 (a) On bobwhite quail: The season shall open on
- 11 Thanksgiving day and run through the first Saturday in March next
- 12 following.

- 13 (b) On pheasant: There shall be no open season on
- 14 pheasant.
- 15 (c) On wild turkey: The commission shall fix the
- 16 spring season between the Saturday nearest March 20 and May 1 in
- 17 designated areas. In addition, the commission may fix special
- 18 fall either-sex seasons. Notwithstanding the opening date of
- 19 turkey season prescribed in this paragraph, if the commission
- 20 <u>establishes a special youth turkey hunt for a weekend, then the</u>
- 21 commission may open the regular season on turkey on the Monday
- 22 immediately following the special youth hunt.
- 23 (d) On squirrel:
- 24 (i) Zone 1: For areas north of Highway 82 plus
- 25 those portions of Sunflower County and Washington County south of
- 26 Highway 82 the season shall open on the Saturday nearest October 1
- 27 and run through February 28.

- 28 (ii) Zone 2: For areas between Highway 82 and
- 29 Highway 84, plus such portions of the state south of Highway 84
- 30 and west of Interstate 55, the season shall open on the Saturday
- 31 nearest October 15 and run through February 28.
- 32 (iii) Zone 3: For areas south of Highway 84 and
- 33 east of Interstate 55 the season shall open on the last Saturday
- 34 in October and run through February 28.
- 35 (e) On deer:
- 36 (i) With bow and arrow: October 1 through the
- 37 Friday prior to Thanksgiving.
- 38 (ii) With guns and with dogs: From the Saturday
- 39 prior to Thanksgiving through December 1.
- 40 (iii) With primitive weapons and without dogs:
- 41 December 2 through December 15.
- 42 (iv) With guns and without dogs: December 16
- 43 through December 23. However, the commission may allow hunting
- 44 statewide or in specific areas with any legal weapon which it may
- 45 designate without dogs after the end of the last season for
- 46 hunting deer with guns and with dogs, but the season with legal
- 47 designated weapons and without dogs shall not extend beyond
- 48 January 31.
- 49 (v) With guns and with dogs: December 24 through
- 50 a date fixed by the commission that will provide a total of
- 51 thirty-nine (39) days of hunting deer with guns and with dogs when
- 52 added to the number of days provided for hunting deer with guns
- 53 and with dogs in paragraph (e)(ii).
- 54 (vi) When hunting deer during any gun season on
- 55 deer, a hunter must wear in full view five hundred (500) square
- 56 inches of solid unbroken fluorescent orange.
- 57 (vii) In order to set and regulate the deer
- 58 seasons, the commission may:
- 59 A. Set and regulate the deer seasons on

51	B. Allow the harvesting of antlerless deer in
52	the districts or zones upon the recommendation of the executive
53	director based upon good and substantial quantitative data and
54	research evaluations that demonstrate that the harvesting is
55	necessary to properly manage the herd. The commission, only upon
56	the recommendation of the executive director, may allow the
57	harvesting of antlerless deer during the deer season with guns and
58	with dogs by a majority vote of the commission. Nothing in this
59	section prohibits the harvesting of either sex deer by landowners
70	or leaseholders on private lands under a deer management program
71	prescribed or approved by the executive director.
72	C. Provide a special permit for the
73	harvesting of deer when they are depredating and destroying crops.
74	The department shall supervise the harvesting and provide for the
75	salvaging of the meat of the animals. The commission may
76	authorize the department to assist any farmer in this state, who
77	sustains crop damage by wildlife, in eradication of the problem
78	wildlife.
79	(viii) The commission shall establish a special
30	hunting season for youth under the age of sixteen (16) and for
31	handicapped persons in the Natchez State Park. The commission
32	shall also establish a primitive weapon season in the Natchez
33	State Park. The selection of participants in the primitive weapon
84	season shall be by public drawing from all qualified applications.
35	The commission shall set the number of permits to be issued and
36	the length of the special seasons. The commission may also
37	establish a special hunting season for youth and handicapped
88	persons or a primitive weapon season as provided in this
39	subparagraph in any other state park under the jurisdiction of the
90	department but shall only do so upon the recommendation of the
91	staff of the department as approved by the commission. The
92	commission shall select participants and set the number of permits

- 93 to be issued and the length of the special seasons in the manner
- 94 provided in this subparagraph.
- 95 (ix) The commission may establish and regulate
- 96 special youth hunts for all nonmigratory game birds and animals
- 97 outside of the open season on wildlife management areas and on
- 98 private lands.
- 99 (f) On fur-bearing animals: The commission may fix the
- 100 open season on fur-bearing animals between November 1 and March 1
- 101 next following and fix the open season for hunting opossums,
- 102 raccoons and bobcats with dogs and guns by licensed hunters from
- 103 October 1 to February 28 next following; but raccoons and bobcats
- 104 may be run, hunted, chased or pursued throughout the year with
- 105 dogs by licensed hunters. The commission may establish an
- 106 additional open season on raccoon from July 1 through October 1,
- 107 and the bag limit on raccoon during the additional open season
- 108 shall be one (1) per party, per night.
- 109 (g) On rabbits: The season shall open on the Saturday
- 110 nearest October 15 and run through February 28 next following, and
- 111 when rabbits are depredating or destroying crops, the owner of the
- 112 crops or his tenants may shoot the rabbits with guns.
- (h) On predatory animals: The hunting of predatory
- 114 animals shall be restricted to the open seasons for hunting any
- 115 game animal or game bird, using only the firearms, ammunition,
- 116 primitive weapons or archery equipment legal for use during that
- 117 open season. Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
- 118 designated agents may take predatory animals year-round on lands
- 119 owned or leased by them. The taking of any animal or animals
- 120 other than beavers or coyote by the use of a trap or traps is
- 121 unlawful except during the time the season is open for the taking
- 122 of fur-bearing animals. Fox and coyote may be run, chased or
- 123 pursued with dogs except as provided in Section 49-7-32 year-round
- 124 by licensed hunters.

- (j) It is unlawful to trap fox after the closed season for trapping of other fur-bearing animals, except on property owned or leased by the person trapping.
- 131 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the open season 132 for game birds and game animals shall be stabilized unless some 133 unforeseen calamity affecting the resource necessitates earlier 134 change.
- 135 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 136 and after July 1, 2004.
