4 ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

7 amended as follows:

8 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi

9 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or

10 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be

11 administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial

12 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, Mississippi

13 Code of 1972, which shall set the dates and deadlines for applying

14 for an award under this section. The board shall establish such

15 rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry

16 out the purposes and intent of this act.

17 (2) The college or university shall approve grants to

18 full-time freshmen, sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi

19 residents who meet the general requirements for student

20 eligibility as provided in subsection (4) of this section.

21 (3) Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be

22 for Mississippi students from any Mississippi family whose prior

23 year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to

24 qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal

25 aid. Those Mississippi students receiving less than the full Pell

26 Grant award, as determined by the institution, shall receive a

27 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to

28 exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual

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- 29 student. The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals,
- 30 books, materials and fees not to exceed One Thousand Dollars
- 31 (\$1,000.00) for junior and senior students attending state
- 32 institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year
- 33 regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and
- 34 universities in Mississippi, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)
- 35 for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher
- 36 learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or
- 37 regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or
- 38 four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per
- 39 term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of
- 40 attendance, calculated according to the formula specified in
- 41 subsection (8) of this section.
- 42 (4) The general requirements for initial eligibility of
- 43 students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants
- 44 consist of the following:
- 45 (a) Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year
- 46 adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify
- 47 for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid.
- 48 (b) Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution
- 49 of higher learning or public community or junior college located
- 50 in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved,
- 51 nonprofit four- or two-year college or university located in
- 52 Mississippi as listed in subsection (d) of this Section
- 53 37-106-29(4): (i) a minimum grade point average of 2.5 calculated
- on a 4.0 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high
- 55 school counselor or other authorized school official on the
- 56 application and graduation from high school verified by the
- 57 institution before disbursement of award and has scored fifteen
- 58 (15) on the American College Test Program (ACT); or (ii) has
- 59 attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through
- 60 12, and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Testing
- Program; or (iii) satisfactory completion of the General S. B. No. 3022 *SSO1/R1222*

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62 Educational Development Test (GED) or have successfully completed
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- 63 the International Baccalaureate Program and has scored fifteen
- 64 (15) on the American College Testing Program; provided, however,
- 65 that any student entering a vocational or technical program of
- 66 study, or who has satisfactorily completed the General Education
- 67 Development Test and attends a community or junior college will
- 68 not be required to have a test score under the American College
- 69 Testing Program except those students enrolled in courses of
- 70 academic study. Any student currently enrolled in any qualified
- 71 institution shall have to only meet the same requirements as
- 72 students who are applying for a renewal award.
- 73 (c) Resident status for purposes of receiving grants
- 74 under this act shall be determined in the same manner as resident
- 75 status for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1
- 76 through 37-103-29, with the exception of 37-103-17.
- 77 (d) Must attend one (1) of the following institutions
- 78 of higher learning: Alcorn State University, Delta State
- 79 University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State
- 80 University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley
- 81 State University, University of Mississippi, University of
- 82 Southern Mississippi, Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln
- 83 Community College, East Central Community College, East
- 84 Mississippi Community College, Hinds Community College, Holmes
- 85 Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior
- 86 College, Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community
- 87 College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, Northeast
- 88 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community
- 89 College, Pearl River Community College, Southwest Mississippi
- 90 Community College, Belhaven College, Blue Mountain College,
- 91 Millsaps College, Mississippi College, Rust College, Tougaloo
- 92 College, William Carey College, Mary Holmes College, Magnolia
- 93 Bible College, Wood College, or the branch of University College
- 94 of Tulane University located in Biloxi, Mississippi.

- 95 By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance 96 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's 97 98 eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in 99 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award 100 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be 101 made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to 102 receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon 103 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the 104 105 county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all 106 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully 107 obtained.
- 108 (6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
 109 Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester,
 110 or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a
 111 student shall:
- 112 (a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
 113 or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
 114 Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.
 - (b) Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the administering agency; examples of cause may include student participation in a cooperative program, internship program or foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, the student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year.
- (c) Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or trimester or term.

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- (7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free 128 129 Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of 130 Certification as designed by the administering board to determine 131 his/her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance
- 132 Grant.

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- 133 (8) (a) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum 134 amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the 135 136 difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited college of choice and the amount of federal aid such student may 137 138 receive, not to supplant but to supplement the amount of any federal aid awarded to the student. Cost of attendance is the 139 140 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance
- (b) Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition 142 143 Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the 144 educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to 145 be applied first to tuition.

- In order for an institution to remain eligible for its 146 147 students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 148 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 149 following requirements:
- 150 A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility (a) status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each 151 152 term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant. 153
- 154 The institution is required to make refunds to the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds 155 which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of 156 157 students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment 158 during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year 159 if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a 160 The recipient shall be responsible for refund in such instance. S. B. No. 3022

- 161 the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the
- 162 institution in such instance.
- 163 (c) If a student drops below full-time status but does
- 164 not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter
- 165 of the academic year no refund will be required for that term.
- 166 However, that student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi
- 167 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term,
- 168 semester or quarter of the regular academic year.
- 169 (d) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any
- 170 institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 171 Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an
- 172 institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the
- 173 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the
- 174 provisions of this act. In determining a student's initial
- 175 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be
- 176 counted against the student.
- 177 (10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition
- 178 Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or
- 179 quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one
- 180 (1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.
- 181 (11) Subject to the availability of funds specifically
- 182 appropriated therefor, it is the intent of the Legislature to
- 183 fully fund grant awards to eligible students. If funds are
- 184 insufficient to fully fund grant awards to eligible students,
- 185 grant awards shall be prorated among all eligible students. No
- 186 student shall receive any combination of student financial aid in
- 187 excess of the cost of attendance as defined in subsection (8)(a).
- 188 (12) No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars
- 189 Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible to
- 190 receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant
- 191 to Section 37-106-29 unless he is eligible for such award after
- 192 the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the
- 193 board when conducting an assessment of the financial resources

194	available to the student. In no case shall any student receive
195	any combination of student financial aid that would exceed the
196	cost of attendance, as defined in subsection (8)(a).
197	For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean but not
198	be limited to all postsecondary vocational programs in eligible
199	institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of this section.
200	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

201 and after July 1, 2004.
