SENATE BILL NO. 3122

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AID AND SUPPORT OF THE 1 PUBLIC COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI 2 3 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid and support 8 of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... 9 10 85,324,534.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 13 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, not otherwise 14 15 appropriated, for the aid and support of public community and 16 junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... \$ 26,602,239.00. 17 18 SECTION 3. In the 3/5 Headcount Formula such Academic, Technical, and 37 38 Vocational funds shall be disbursed to such public community and junior colleges on the basis of the full-time enrollment of each 39 40 such public community and junior college as of the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester, or its equivalent, of the 41 preceding year, counting only students who reside within the State 42 of Mississippi. Part-time academic, vocational, and technical 43 44 credit courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year 45 full-time equivalency of part-time and summer students, counting only students who reside within the State of Mississippi. 46

47 Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may 48 qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of 49 virtual community college hours generated during the summer, fall 50 and spring semesters. Those semester credit hours being hosted 51 and provided by one institution shall receive funding at the 52 weight of 1.0

In the 2/5 FTE Formula, such Academic, Technical, Vocational, 53 54 Associate Degree Nursing and Associate Degree Allied Health funds shall be disbursed on the basis of prior year full-time 55 equivalency (FTE) of hours generated during the summer, fall and 56 57 spring semesters for each public community and junior college as of the last day of the sixth week of each semester, or its 58 59 equivalent, counting only students who reside within the State of 60 Mississippi. 61 reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay 62 purposes.

Of the funds appropriated in the act for the aid and support of the public community and junior colleges, funds up to Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000.00) are provided to be set aside as a mechanism to hold harmless those colleges that lose funding in the second year of a five year phase-in implementation period to a full-time equivalency (FTE) funding formula.

The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, or his designee, shall audit each public community and junior college and shall determine who shall be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

74 If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at 75 the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the 76 77 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall find and 78 determine that any such public or community junior college does not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary 79 80 expenses of its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2004, 81 until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, then, in that 82 event, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges is expressly authorized to make an advance to any such public 83 84 community or junior college or colleges not having sufficient 85 operating funds for such period from the funds appropriated hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any such advance to 86 87 any one public community or junior college shall not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state appropriated 88 funds received by such public community or junior college during 89 the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, that the amount 90 91 of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of 92 the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public community or

95 SECTION 4. No part of the amount herein appropriated shall 96 be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for 97 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the 98 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the 99 expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

100 **SECTION 5.** The funds disbursed under the provisions of this 101 act shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community 102 and Junior Colleges.

SECTION 6. The following public community and junior colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by Sections 1 and 2 of this act:

106 Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community 107 108 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community 109 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, 110 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast 111 112 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community 113 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi 114 Community College.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any public community and junior college employee who is serving as a member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.

SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and allied health student loans and providing instructional support S. July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005..... \$ 1,200,000.00.
The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as
follows:

(1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)public community and junior colleges.

(2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent of the preceding year counting only those students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in these sections which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 249 250 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 251 Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the 252 cost of the Holmes Community College Industrial Technology 253 Complex, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending 254 June 30, 2005..... \$ 150,000.00. 255 SECTION 19.
