6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
8	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
9	maintenance of the Mississippi Department of Corrections for the
10	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005
11	\$ 214,908,264.00.
12	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
13	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
14	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
15	Department of Corrections which is collected by or otherwise
16	become available for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
17	Department, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending
18	June 30, 2005\$ 12,730,540.00.
19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
20	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
21	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of

Based on data provided by the 132 133 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 134 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 135 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 136 137 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 138 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 139 140 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 141 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 142 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" 143 144 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 145 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 146 147 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 148 149 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 150 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 151 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 152 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 153 154 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 155 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the appropriated level. 156 157 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 158 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this

act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

208	SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
209	and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention
210	of the Legislature that any contractual service payments made by
211	the department to defray medical expenses for inmates shall be at
212	the currently established Medicaid reimbursement rate; however, if
213	hospital and medical providers will not contract at the Medicaid
214	reimbursement rate, the Department of Corrections may enter into a
215	negotiated contract.
216	SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
217	none shall be expended for personnel housing under the
218	jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the
219	department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of
220	fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities
221	furnished to said housing. The Department of Corrections shall
222	not pay for the installation or monthly service of any telephone
223	installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction.
224	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
225	and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be
226	authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued

- 229 **SECTION 9.** No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be
- 230 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the
- 231 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles
- 232 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the
- 233 Governor in each specific case.
- 234 **SECTION 10.** None of the money herein appropriated shall be
- 235 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47,
- 236 Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an
- 237 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State
- 238 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually

- 251 **SECTION 11.** It is the intent of the Legislature that all
- 252 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per
- 253 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those
- 254 incarcerated in maximum security.
- 255 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 256 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 257 budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise
- 258 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the

- 259 purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for
- 260 use within the department.
- 261 **SECTION 13.** None of the funds appropriated herein can be
- 262 directly or indirectly associated with the ACA accreditation in
- 263 the Community Services Division.
- 264 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 265 per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed
- 266 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 267 All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three
- 268 percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in
- 269 Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event
- 270 shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine
- 271 Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 272 **SECTION 15.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 273 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections may
- 274 transfer between certain budgets authorized in Section 3,
- 275 including Support, Medical Services, Parole Board, Farming
- 276 Operations, and Private Prisons, both positions and funds in an
- 277 amount not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized
- 278 budgets in the aggregate. The Commissioner of the Mississippi
- 279 Department of Corrections shall submit written justification for
- 280 the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department
- 281 of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the
- 282 month prior to the effective date of the transfer. However, no
- 283 transfers shall be authorized which increase the major object of
- 284 expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits" in any budget
- 285 authorized in Section 3 of this act.
- 286 **SECTION 16.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 287 Mississippi Department of Corrections may use funds appropriated
- 288 herein to enter into a lease purchase agreement through the State
- 289 Master Lease Program to purchase property located at 421 West
- 290 Pascagoula Street in Jackson, Mississippi, for use as the Hinds
- 291 County Probation and Parole Office and the Statewide Records

292	Office for the Mississippi Department of Corrections. Total
293	outlays for any such agreement to purchase this facility must be
294	less than the total outlays to lease this property over a ten-year
295	period and shall be approved by the Executive Director of the
296	Department of Finance and Administration.
297	SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
298	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
299	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
300	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
301	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
302	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
303	SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from
304	and after July 1, 2004.
