AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 1 THE EXPENSES OF THE VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005. 2 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 5 б General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 7 defraying the expenses and paying salaries of the Veterans Affairs 8 Board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending 9 June 30, 2005.....\$ 1,327,489.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 10 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Veterans Affairs 12 Board which is comprised of special source funds collected by or 13 otherwise available to the board, for the support and maintenance 14 of said board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and 15 ending June 30, 2005..... \$ 21,162,886.00. 16 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 17 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 18 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 19 Full Time..... 20 Permanent: 74 Part Time..... 21 0 22 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 399 23 Part Time..... 56 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 24 25 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 26 Services" for Fiscal Year 2006 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2005 27 *SS05/A731* S. 28 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 29 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2006 budget by the 30 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 31 32 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 33 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 34 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 35 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2005 appropriation for "Personal 36 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 37 38 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 39 40 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2005 "Personal Services" 41 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 42 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 43 44 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 45 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 46 47 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 48 49 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 50 The 51 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 52 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 53 appropriated level. 54

55 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 56 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 57 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 58 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

59 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 60 Sections 1 and 2, funds in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty S. B. No. 3143 *SS05/A731* 04/SS05/A731 PAGE 2

Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) are provided to defray the cost of 61 62 providing care to indigent/low-income Mississippi veterans and the 63 non-veteran surviving spouses of Mississippi veterans if the 64 surviving spouse was a resident of a state veterans home at the 65 time of the veteran's death and who, subsequent to the veteran's 66 death, meets the indigent/low-income criteria established by the State Veterans Affairs Board, in the state veterans homes. 67 Tt is the intention of the Legislature that the provision pertaining to 68 use of indigent/low-income surviving spouses be retroactive for 69 70 any such period, prior to the effective date of this act, that a 71 current surviving spouse may have met the criteria. This section and its provisions shall be known and cited as the "Hilton R. 72 73 'Jack' Vance Act of 1997."

74 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 75 Veterans Affairs Board shall maintain complete accounting and 76 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 77 appropriated under the provisions of this act and that such 78 records shall be in the same format and level of details as maintained for Fiscal Year 2004. It is further the intention of 79 80 the Legislature that the budget request for Fiscal Year 2006 shall 81 be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 82 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2005 budget request process. 83

84 SECTION 6. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 85 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 86 87 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 88 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 89 SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from 90 91 and after July 1, 2004.
