COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 3175

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 58, LAWS OF THE EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF 1954, AS LAST AMENDED BY CHAPTER 989, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1999, TO AUTHORIZE A PORTION OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE TAX LEVIED ON CERTAIN ROOM RENTALS TO BE UTILIZED TO PAY THE DEBT SERVICE ON 3 4 CERTAIN ADDITIONAL GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY ISSUED 5 6 FOR THE PURPOSE OF RETIRING CERTAIN BONDS ISSUED FOR THE PURPOSE 7 OF DEFRAYING THE COST OF EXPANDING THE MISSISSIPPI COAST COLISEUM 8 AND CONVENTION CENTER AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE COST OF 9 CONSTRUCTING, REPAIRING, EQUIPPING, REMODELING, ENLARGING, EXPANDING OR IMPROVING THE MISSISSIPPI COAST COLISEUM AND 10 CONVENTION CENTER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 11

- 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 13 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 58, Laws of the Extraordinary Session of
- 14 1954, as amended by Chapter 810, Local and Private Laws of 1966,
- 15 as amended by Chapter 820, Local and Private Laws of 1972, as
- 16 amended by Chapter 973, Local and Private Laws of 1979, as amended
- 17 by Chapter 881, Local and Private Laws of 1980, as amended by
- 18 Chapter 918, Local and Private Laws of 1990, as amended by Chapter
- 19 882, Local and Private Laws of 1991, as amended by Chapter 937,
- 20 Local and Private Laws of 1995, as amended by Chapter 989, Local
- 21 and Private Laws of 1999, is amended as follows:
- 22 Section 1. The Board of Supervisors of Harrison County,
- 23 Mississippi, in its discretion, may levy a special ad valorem tax
- 24 not in excess of one (1) mill upon all the taxable property within
- 25 said county to provide funds for the Harrison County Tourism
- 26 Commission for the purpose of advertising, promoting conventions,
- 27 and bringing into favorable notice the opportunities,
- 28 possibilities and tourism resources of said county.
- 29 Section 2. (1) For the purposes of providing funds to
- 30 promote tourism and conventions in Harrison County, there is
- 31 hereby levied and assessed against and shall be collected from

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- 32 every person, firm or corporation operating hotels or motels in
- 33 Harrison County an assessment, in addition to all other taxes now
- imposed, which shall be equal to three percent (3%) of the gross
- 35 proceeds from room rental of all such hotels or motels in Harrison
- 36 County. Persons liable for the tax imposed herein shall add the
- 37 amount of tax to the room rental and in addition thereto shall
- 38 collect, insofar as practicable, the amount of the tax due by him
- 39 from the person receiving the services or goods at the time of
- 40 payment therefor.
- 41 (2) For the purposes of this act, the words "hotel" and
- 42 "motel" shall mean a place of lodging that at any one time will
- 43 accommodate transient guests on a daily or weekly basis and that
- 44 are known to the trade as such, including hotels, motels, bed and
- 45 breakfast inns, time-share condominiums, tourist courts, rooming
- 46 houses or other places where sleeping accommodations are furnished
- 47 or offered for pay if more than ten (10) rooms are available for
- 48 transient guests, excluding nursing homes or institutions for the
- 49 aged or infirm as defined in Section 43-11-1 and personal care
- 50 homes. Hotels and motels with ten (10) or less rental units are
- 51 exempt.
- 52 (3) Such tax shall be collected by and paid to the State Tax
- 53 Commission on a form to be prescribed by the State Tax Commission
- in the same manner that state sales taxes are collected and paid;
- 55 and the full enforcement provisions and all other provisions of
- 56 the Mississippi Sales Tax Law shall apply as necessary for the
- 57 implementation and administration of this act.
- 58 (4) On or before the fifteenth day of the month following
- 59 the month in which collected, the proceeds of such tax, less three
- 60 percent (3%) to be retained by the State Tax Commission to defray
- 61 the costs of collection, shall be paid by the commission, as
- 62 follows, for expenditure as authorized in this act:
- 63 (a) Two-thirds (2/3) of the proceeds shall be paid to
- 64 the Harrison County Tourism Commission.

- (b) One-third (1/3) of the proceeds shall be paid to the Board of Supervisors of Harrison County.
- 67 Section 3. The Harrison County Tourism Commission shall be
- 68 composed of seven (7) members, appointed as hereinafter provided.
- 69 The board of supervisors shall appoint two (2) members of the
- 70 commission who are qualified electors of the City of Biloxi; two
- 71 (2) members who are qualified electors of the City of Gulfport;
- 72 one (1) member who is a qualified elector of the City of Pass
- 73 Christian; one (1) member who is a qualified elector of the City
- 74 of Long Beach; and one (1) member who is a qualified elector of
- 75 the County of Harrison outside of the boundaries of the four (4)
- 76 municipalities in the county. In the selection of commissioners,
- 77 the board shall make every effort to select individuals who are
- 78 knowledgeable of, or actively involved in, the tourism industry.
- 79 The said commission shall be appointed within sixty (60) days of
- 80 the effective date of this act, in the following manner:
- 81 (1) Two (2) members for one (1) year.
- 82 (2) Two (2) members for two (2) years.
- 83 (3) One (1) member for three (3) years.
- 84 (4) One (1) member for four (4) years.
- 85 (5) One (1) member for five (5) years.
- The board shall draw lots to determine which of the seven (7)
- 87 members of the commission shall be appointed for the various
- 88 initial terms of office. Provided, however, that all subsequent
- 89 appointments shall be made for five-year terms, except that the
- 90 board shall appoint a member to fill a vacancy for the unexpired
- 91 term only. Within sixty (60) days after the effective date of
- 92 House Bill No. 1716, 1990 Regular Session, the board of
- 93 supervisors shall appoint two (2) additional members to the
- 94 Tourism Commission. The board of supervisors shall appoint one
- 95 (1) member who is a qualified elector of the City of d'Iberville
- 96 and one (1) member who is a qualified elector of the County of
- 97 Harrison for a term of five (5) years. All subsequent

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appointments shall be for a term of five (5) years and an
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     appointment to fill a vacancy shall be for the unexpired term
     only. Before entering on the duties of the office each appointed
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     member of the Tourism Commission shall enter into and give bond to
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     be approved by the Secretary of State of the State of Mississippi
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     in the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars ($50,000.00) conditioned on
     the satisfactory performance of his duties. This bond's premium
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     shall be paid from the Tourism Commission Fund. Such bond shall
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     be payable to Harrison County and in the event of a breach
     thereof, suit may be brought by the county for the benefit of the
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     Tourism Commission. The commission may authorize the payment of
     per diem not to exceed the uniform per diem rate provided in
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     Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, to commission members
     for each day in the discharge of their official duties.
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     diem expenditures shall be included in the annual budget of the
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     commission and shall be subject to approval of the Harrison County
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     Board of Supervisors. The commission shall elect officers and
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     adopt rules and regulations; and shall fix a regular meeting date,
     but may provide for special meetings. The commission shall keep
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     minutes of its proceedings, as are necessary to carry out its
     responsibilities under this act. It is the intent of this
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     enactment to supersede the Advisory Commission and those duties
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     performed by the board of supervisors pursuant to Chapter 820,
     Local and Private Laws of 1972, with the commission herein
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     created, and to provide for the orderly transfer of all duties and
     powers heretofore exercised by those bodies to the Harrison County
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     Tourism Commission, which shall have the sole authority to budget
     and contract for expenditures for the fiscal year beginning
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     October 1, 1979, subject to the approval of the board of
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     supervisors as herein provided.
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                      Before the expenditures of funds allocated to it
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          Section 4.
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     by this act, the Tourism Commission shall annually adopt a budget
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that will reflect the anticipated expenditures for promotion,

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- 131 advertising and operation. Such budget shall be subject to the
- 132 approval of the Harrison County Board of Supervisors and shall
- 133 comply with all the requirements of the general laws of the State
- 134 of Mississippi covering the advertisement for bids and the
- 135 expenditure of funds.
- 136 Section 5. The Harrison County Tourism Commission
- 137 established hereunder shall have the authority to promote tourism
- 138 and in this regard the commission is empowered:
- 139 (a) To receive and expend revenues from any sources
- 140 including, but not limited to, private enterprise;
- 141 (b) To own, lease or contract for the use, purchase or
- 142 lease of any real or personal property, including, but not limited
- 143 to, furnishings, fixtures and any equipment useful and necessary
- 144 in the promotion of tourism and convention business;
- 145 (c) To sell, convey or otherwise dispose of all or any
- 146 part of its property and assets in accordance with general laws of
- 147 the State of Mississippi providing for such disposal;
- 148 (d) To have and exercise all powers necessary or
- 149 convenient to effect any and all of the purposes for which the
- 150 commission is organized, and further, to appoint and employ
- 151 individuals and agencies acting in its behalf for any and all of
- 152 the aforementioned powers and responsibilities;
- (e) To have and exercise all powers necessary and
- 154 convenient to conduct the business of promoting and managing
- 155 conventions and to carry out the purposes of the convention staff
- 156 of the Mississippi Coast Coliseum Commission by agreement between
- 157 the two (2) commissions.
- 158 Section 6. The Advisory Commission, created and established
- 159 under the provisions of Chapter 820, Local and Private Laws of
- 160 1972, shall be and the same is hereby abolished effective October
- 161 1, 1979, and the commissioners and all members, agents,

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- 162 representatives and employees of the said Advisory Commission and
- 163 the Harrison County Board of Supervisors are required and directed

165 effectuate an orderly transfer of its duties to that commission in 166 accordance with this act, and to deliver to the Harrison County 167 Tourism Commission all property, funds, money, accounts, records, 168 etc., now in their possession, which were transferred to the board 169 of supervisors pursuant to Chapter 820, Local and Private Laws of 1972, such delivery to be made not later than October 1, 1979, and 170 where required, in such cases as real property, if any, the 171 Chairman of the said Advisory Commission and the Secretary thereof 172 173 or the President of the Harrison County Board of Supervisors are 174 authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute and deliver in favor of the Harrison County Tourism Commission any bill of sale, 175 176 deed or other document required to transfer title of any property transferred pursuant to Chapter 820, Local and Private Laws of 177 1972, which was held in the name of the County Advertising 178 Commission. Nothing herein shall be construed to waive the rights 179 180 of compelling such action by a writ of mandamus in accordance with 181 the laws of Mississippi. Provided further, that on October 1, 1979, all rights of office of any of the commissioners of the 182 183 Advisory Commission, its attorneys or agents, be and the same are hereby finally determined and ended, and its former employees 184 185 shall serve at the pleasure of the Tourism Commission. Section 7. (a) The Board of Supervisors of Harrison County 186 187 shall deposit the funds allocated to it by Section 2(4)(b) of this 188 act into a special fund in the county treasury. (b) Monies in the special fund shall be expended by the 189 190 board of supervisors to pay the principal of and interest on up to Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) of general obligation bonds 191 issued by the county after May 1, 1995, but prior to the effective 192 date of Senate Bill No. 3175, 2004 Regular Session, to defray the 193 194 costs of expanding the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention 195 Center.

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196	(c) Monies in the special fund may also be expended by
197	the board of supervisors to pay the principal of and interest on
198	not more than Seventy Million Dollars (\$70,000,000.00) of general
199	obligation bonds issued by the county for the purpose of:
200	(i) retiring bonds issued by the board of
201	supervisors after May 1, 1995, but prior to the effective date of
202	Senate Bill No. 3175, 2004 Regular Session, to defray the costs of
203	expanding the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center;
204	and
205	(ii) Defraying the cost of constructing,
206	repairing, equipping, remodeling, enlarging, expanding or
207	improving the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center.
208	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
209	and after its passage.
