SENATE BILL NO. 3208

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA TO CREATE THE 1 2 PHILADELPHIA-NESHOBA COUNTY MUSEUM COUNCIL; TO PROVIDE THE 3 COMPOSITION AND POWERS OF THE COUNCIL; TO AUTHORIZE THE GOVERNING AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA AND NESHOBA COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO CONTRIBUTE \$25,000.00 EACH FOR THE PURPOSE OF 4 5 б PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A MUSEUM IN 7 THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA AND NESHOBA COUNTY; AND FOR RELATED 8 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 10 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is hereby created the 11 Philadelphia-Neshoba County Museum Council, hereinafter referred to as the "council." The council shall be composed of five (5) 12 members who shall be known as directors. 13 14 The council shall be composed of the following members: (2)(a) Two (2) members appointed by the governing 15 authorities of the City of Philadelphia; 16 (b) Two (2) members appointed by the Board of 17 Supervisors of Neshoba County, Mississippi; and 18 19 (c) One (1) member appointed by the Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians. 20 (3) Each member of the council shall serve a five-year term 21 or until his successor is appointed and qualified. Vacancies on 22 23 the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment for the unexpired term. 24 (4) Any director may be disqualified and removed from office 25 for conviction of a felony or for failure to attend three (3) 26 consecutive meetings without just cause. 27 28 (5) Before entering on the duties of office, each director shall enter into and give bond to be approved by the Secretary of 29 State in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), conditioned 30 *SS26/R1429* S. on the satisfactory performance of his or her duties. This bond 31 32 premium shall be paid from the commission's funds, and the bond shall be payable to the county for the benefit of the council. 33 34 (6) When the directors of the council shall have been 35 appointed and qualified, they shall meet in the City of 36 Philadelphia after giving not less than ten (10) days' notice of the time and place of such meeting by registered mail, postage 37 prepaid, that is directed to each member of the council at his or 38 her regular address at the time of his or her qualification and 39 posting bond. Such notice shall be given by the Board of 40 41 Supervisors of Neshoba County, Mississippi. The notice of such meeting may be waived if all directors sign a written waiver of 42 43 such notice. Any such waiver shall be attached to the minutes of 44 the meeting.

45 The directors shall elect from among themselves a (7) chairman. The chairman of the council shall serve a term of not 46 more than one (1) year, with the first election to be held at the 47 48 first scheduled meeting after the directors are appointed, and subsequent elections shall be held annually thereafter. 49 The 50 person elected as chairman may serve consecutive terms. The council shall elect from its membership a vice chairman, secretary 51 52 and treasurer. The offices of secretary and treasurer may be combined, if the council so elects. The council may promulgate 53 54 and adopt bylaws governing its operations and procedures. Three 55 (3) directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business of the council. 56

SECTION 2. The council shall be domiciled in the City of 57 Philadelphia, Mississippi, and shall have the following powers: 58 59 To exercise authority over matters related to (a) establishing, promoting, developing and maintaining a museum 60 within the City of Philadelphia and/or Neshoba County; 61 62 (b) To acquire, either by purchase or donation, and/or to own, lease, furnish, equip, staff and operate any and all 63 *SS26/R1429* S. 64 facilities and equipment necessary or useful in the promotion of 65 the museum within the City of Philadelphia and Neshoba County;

(d) To own, lease or contract for any equipment or
office space useful and necessary in the promotion of the museum;
(e) To sell, convey or otherwise dispose of all or any

To receive and expend revenues from any source;

70 part of its property and assets in accordance with the general 71 laws of the State of Mississippi providing for such disposal; 72 (f) To make all expenditures necessary to provide for

73 the operation and maintenance of the museum that conform to the 74 purchasing laws of the State of Mississippi; and

75 (g) To have and exercise all powers necessary or 76 convenient to effect any and all of the purposes for which the 77 council is organized.

78 SECTION 3. (1) For the purpose of providing funds for the 79 operation and maintenance of a museum in the City of Philadelphia 80 and Neshoba County, the governing authorities of the City of 81 Philadelphia, Mississippi, and the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County, Mississippi, are authorized, in their discretion, to 82 83 contribute a sum not to exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) each for each fiscal year for the operation and 84 85 maintenance of the museum. The contribution of the county and city, if any, shall be in equal amounts each fiscal year. 86

87 (2) The contributions, if any, by the county and city shall
88 be made from the general fund of the county and city and no taxing
89 authority is granted.

90 **SECTION 4.** (1) The council shall adopt annually a budget of receipts and expenditures. The first budget of receipts and 91 expenditures shall be prepared and adopted by the council within 92 thirty (30) days after the election of its first chairman and, 93 94 upon approval by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of 95 Philadelphia and the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County, such 96 budget shall constitute the budget for the remainder of the *SS26/R1429* S. 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97 current fiscal year. Thereafter, the budget shall be on the same 98 fiscal year basis as the budget of the county. The annual 99 proposed budget of the council shall be submitted to the Mayor and 100 Board of Alderman of the City of Philadelphia and the Board of 101 Supervisors of Neshoba County, for review, and upon approval by 102 both governmental entities, such budget shall constitute the 103 budget of the council for that fiscal year.

104 (2) The council may borrow money to pay its operating 105 obligations that cannot be paid at maturity out of current revenue 106 from the contributions authorized in this act, but the amount so 107 borrowed shall in no case exceed the estimated income of the 108 council as shown by the budget adopted before that time, and the 109 contributions of the council, as shown by the budget, shall be 110 dedicated and set aside to the payment of indebtedness.

(3) The books of the council shall be audited annually by an 111 independent certified public accountant who shall make a written 112 113 report of the audit to the council and shall submit a copy of such 114 report to the governing authorities of the City of Philadelphia, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County, and the State 115 116 Department of Audit. Such audit shall be made and completed as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal year and copies 117 118 of the report of the audit shall be filed with the city, county and State Department of Audit within fifteen (15) days after 119 120 receipt by the council.

121 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from 122 and after its passage.

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
