SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 527

1 2	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO MAKE MORE STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR FREE SCHOOL LUNCHES.
3	WHEREAS, the federal child nutrition programs, including the
4	school lunch and breakfast programs, are important to the health
5	and education of the children of Mississippi; and
б	WHEREAS, the child nutrition programs must be reauthorized by
7	the Congress of the United States during the current fiscal year;
8	and
9	WHEREAS, reduced price school meals are offered, in
10	participating schools, to children with family income between 130%
11	of the poverty line and 185% of the poverty line; and
12	WHEREAS, many families in the reduced price income category
13	are finding it difficult to pay the reduced fee and, for some
14	families, the fee is an insurmountable barrier to participation;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women,
17	Infants and Children (WIC) provides free benefits to all
18	participants with family income below 185% of poverty; and
19	WHEREAS, legislation has been introduced by Senators Dole
20	(R-NC) and Roberts (R-KS) to phase-out the reduced price meal
21	program, harmonizing school meals with WIC:
22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
23	MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
24	the State of Mississippi supports reauthorization of all federal
25	child nutrition programs.
26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the State of Mississippi urges

the Congress of the United States to eliminate the reduced price
