- A WRITTEN REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2004; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5
- 6 WHEREAS, Mississippi's tax structure has been revised over
- 7 the years with little concern for its fairness and the effect that
- 8 the tax structure has on the state's economy; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mississippi relies heavily on sales taxation to
- produce revenue and the boom in sales over the Internet creates 10
- many taxable transactions for which collection of the sales tax is 11
- 12 impractical; and
- WHEREAS, the increase in Internet sales threatens to erode 13
- 14 the sales tax base of this state; and
- WHEREAS, the many sales tax exemptions contained in the 15
- 16 current law need to be examined to determine their desirability
- and to determine whether other taxable transactions should be 17
- 18 exempt; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the income tax laws and estate tax laws contain many
- 20 areas that are in need of study and revision; and
- 21 WHEREAS, any substantive revision to any area of
- 22 Mississippi's tax structure necessarily requires a thorough study
- 23 of the entire structure, both state and local; and
- 24 WHEREAS, for these reasons, it is the determination of the
- Legislature that a special committee should be established to make 25
- a thorough study of the tax structure of the State of Mississippi: 26
- 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 28 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That

    a special joint study committee is created to study Mississippi's

    tax structure and make recommendations concerning the

    implementation of any changes to such structure that such

    committee finds necessary. The joint committee shall be composed

    of the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, the Chairman of

    the House Ways and Means Committee, five (5) members of the Senate

    to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor and five (5) members of
    the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the

            The chairman of the joint committee shall be the Chairman

    of the Senate Finance Committee and the vice chairman shall be the

    Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee.
         Within fifteen (15) days after sine die adjournment of the

    2004 Regular Session of the Legislature, the Lieutenant Governor
    and the Speaker shall appoint the members of the committee. After

    the members are appointed, the joint committee shall meet on a

    date designated by the chairman of the joint committee in Jackson,

    Mississippi, to organize the committee and establish rules for
    transacting its business and keeping records. A majority of the

    members of the joint committee from each house shall constitute a

    quorum at all committee meetings. An affirmative vote of a
    majority of the members from each house shall be required in the

    adoption of rules, resolutions and reports. All members of the
    joint committee shall be notified in writing of all regular and

    special meetings of the committee, which notices shall be mailed

    at least five (5) days before the dates of the meetings.
         The joint committee may establish any subcommittees that it

    to any matter that is within the scope of this resolution.

         The joint committee shall make a written report of its
    findings and recommendations, and shall mail copies of the report

    to each member of the Legislature not later than December 1, 2004.

         In carrying out the provisions of this resolution, the joint

    committee may utilize the services, facilities and personnel of

all departments, agencies, offices and institutions of the state, 62 63 including the state universities and the community and junior 64 In particular, the joint committee shall consult with the State Tax Commission, and the State Tax Commission shall 65 66 cooperate with the committee and provide the committee with any 67 information and other assistance requested by the committee. 68 joint committee may consult and seek advice from various groups in the state in order to understand the effect of any existing laws 69 or any changes in law being considered by the committee. 70 For attending meetings of the joint committee, each member 71 72 shall be paid from the contingent expense fund of the member's respective house, per diem compensation in the amount authorized 73 74 by Section 25-3-69 and a mileage allowance and an expense allowance in the amount authorized by Section 5-1-47. However, no 75 76 per diem compensation, mileage allowance or expense allowance 77 shall be paid for attending meetings of the joint committee while the Legislature is in session, and no per diem compensation, 78 79 mileage allowance or expense allowance shall be paid without prior approval of the proper committee in the member's respective house. 80 81 All expenses incurred by and on behalf of the joint committee shall be paid from funds made available by the House Rules 82 83 Committee and the Senate Rules Committee from the contingent expense funds of the respective houses, from any funds 84 85 appropriated for the purpose of this resolution, and from any 86 grants or contributions made to the committee for its purpose.
