SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 538

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE
UNITED STATES TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION TO PROTECT THE PLEDGE OF
ALLEGIANCE AND OUR NATIONAL MOTTO.
WHEREAS, this nation was founded by people seeking a place

WHEREAS, this nation was founded by people seeking a placewhere they could practice their religion freely; and

6 WHEREAS, the first settlers found themselves in a strange and 7 strenuous land which required them to call upon the strength of 8 their God and to place themselves in His trust; and

9 WHEREAS, our founding fathers, in creating our national Constitution, assured the freedom of choice in one's practice of 10 11 religion. However, our national leaders in times of stress have called upon our belief and trust in a Superior Being to see this 12 nation through difficult times, and have acknowledged the 13 continuous presence of God by inscribing on our currency the 14 15 reassuring phrase "In God We Trust" and by including the phrase "one Nation under God" in our pledge of allegiance; and 16

17 WHEREAS, the strength of a nation can be measured in its 18 citizens' desire for domestic tranquility and in their abiding 19 belief in a Supreme Being. Accordingly, it is urged upon the 20 Congress of the United States that this basic requirement of a 21 great nation be recognized by amending our Constitution as 22 follows:

23 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of 24 the United States of America in Congress assembled 25 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), that 26 the following article is proposed as an amendment to 27 the Constitution of the United States, which shall be 28 s. c. R. No. 538 *SSO1/R780* 04/SS01/R780 PAGE 1 28 valid to all intents and purposes as part of the 29 Constitution when ratified by the Legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years 30 after the date of its submission for ratification. 31 32 Section 1. The first Amendment of the Constitution of 33 the United States shall not be construed to prohibit the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the 34 Flag, which shall be, "I pledge allegiance to the Flag 35 of the United States of America, and to the Republic 36 for which it stands, one Nation under God, 37 indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." 38 Section 2. The first Amendment to the Constitution of 39 40 the United States shall not be construed to prohibit the recitation or use of the national motto, which 41 shall be, "In God We Trust"; and 42

43 WHEREAS, we urge Congress to pass this Constitutional 44 Amendment and to send it on to the individual states for their 45 approval:

46 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 47 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 48 we memorialize the Congress of the United States to seek a 49 Constitutional Amendment to protect the pledge of allegiance and 50 our national motto.

51 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be 52 directed to provide an enrolled copy of this resolution to the 53 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 54 Representatives of the United States Congress and to each member 55 of the Mississippi Congressional Delegation.
